

# PASTOR'S LETTER

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ Jesus,

As a Church, we continue to celebrate the Lord's Resurrection, his triumph over death, and within this Easter's joy today, we celebrate the Sunday dedicated to the Divine Mercy. It is something that goes far beyond a particular devotion; Saint John Paul II, in his encyclical "Dives in Misericordia," explains that the Divine Mercy is the loving manifestation of God in a history wounded by sin and that God places our miserable situation due to sin in his heart as a Father, who is faithful to his designs. Jesus Christ, dead and risen, is the supreme manifestation and performance of the Divine Mercy. "God so loved the world that he gave his Only Begotten Son" (Jn 3, 16) and has sent him to death so that we could be saved. I like a phrase from the Easter Proclamation that we sung at the Easter Vigil that expresses very well God's mercy when he says: "To redeem the slave he has sacrificed the Son," that's how God is, he loves us with mercy, for this reason by faith and in conversion, we welcome the treasure of Divine Mercy.

Changing the subject; as you may have noticed, we have almost finished rebuilding the confessionals. In fact, since Holy Monday, we started using two of them, and now nearly all of them are finished! It is more comfortable for everyone because now there is more privacy. I thank you for your patience during all this time of renovations; although we are not completely finished. Last Monday, we started with the change of the church roof; this is one of the most significant projects at the moment, and since I arrived ten months ago, this project was already planned, and thank God it is already underway. It is estimated that the completion date will be on May 7th, and the total cost will be \$250,000; blessed be God for the generosity of many of you who have not hesitated to help rebuild the house of the Lord. I want to invite those who have not yet made their commitment to the "Capital Campaign" to do so because, with the roof reparation, we will have almost used up all the funds that we have in the account. I know that the promises still stand and because there are still more projects to be done to embellish our sanctuary further.

As we all know, this year is dedicated to Saint Joseph, and some have mentioned to me that our Church does not have an image of him, and that is the truth! There is an image of him in the church, but it is part of the Holy Family. I want to acquire a beautiful statue of him this year and dedicate a space for it. If anyone is interested in collaborating to purchase this statue, you can contact me at the parish office or speak with me after the Masses. It would be an excellent memory of this year dedicated to the adoptive father of Jesus.

Finally, I continue to invite everyone to be part of our ministries. We need more ushers and lectors, as well as extraordinary ministers of the Holy Communion. I ask you to begin participating. I need your help, especially at the 5:00 pm Mass. Those interested in participating, please contact us at the parish office.

May God bless you, and may his infinite mercy always comfort you.

## Religious Education Information

We wish our Religious Education families, catechists, aides, and volunteers a joyous Easter season as we celebrate the resurrection of our Lord.

For your return following Easter break, we ask you again respectfully to be extra cautious and consider the risk of being around people outside your immediate family or going to high risk areas as noted by CDC. Although COVID-19 cases are generally decline, schools are still being impacted by COVID-19 cases. We want to do our best to keep our Religious Education Program at the school open and safe. As a reminder, if your child(ren) or anyone who resides at your home or anyone who has direct contact with your child(ren) travels outside the country, your child(ren) may not return for in-person instruction for 14 days. If you travelled to a high risk area such as an amusement park (e.g. Disney World), we ask you to take extra precautions and keep us informed.

We continue to be vigilant and intentional as we strive to stay healthy. Before coming to RE on Sunday mornings, please monitor for coronavirus and flu symptoms. If symptoms develop, please contact your Primary Health Care Provider immediately, do not attend Religious Education class, and send a message to [s.gray@queenofapostles.org](mailto:s.gray@queenofapostles.org). Thank you for your partnership in taking extra precautions to keep Queen of Apostles parish, school, and Religious Education communities safe and healthy.

## Infant Baptisms at Queen of Apostles

Infant Baptisms are held twice a month on Saturdays: Spanish on the **First Saturday at 10:30 am** and English on the **Third Saturday at 10:30 am**.



Baptism Classes for parents and godparents are held twice a month on Wednesdays: English Classes on the **First Wednesday at 7:30 pm** and Spanish Classes on the **Third Wednesday at 7:30 pm**. Both are held in Hannan Hall. There will be an Spanish Class on **Wednesday, April 21**. There are English Baptisms on Saturday, **April 17**.

The following is required to have your child baptized: A complete registration form along with a copy of the child's birth certificate, attendance at a Pre-Baptismal Class (Parents and Godparents), and Letters of Good Standing from each godparents obtained from their home Parish.

Please submit all paperwork to the Parish Office by the *Monday of the week of the Saturday Baptism*. Failure to submit paperwork on time can result in delaying the Sacrament.

## Altar Servers - Serving Our Lord in the Eucharist

On **April 17 at 12:30pm** (new time) in the church, Fr. Rampino will lead another training/refresher for new, newer, and seasoned altar servers. Boys in grade 4 and above who have received First Holy Communion, are eligible to serve. If your son will attend the training and is willing to serve at Holy Mass on Sundays (8am, 10am, 12noon) and other Masses, please send a message to [s.gray@queenofapostles.org](mailto:s.gray@queenofapostles.org) or talk with Fr. Rampino. Boys who are serving Mass are asked to arrive no less than 15 min before Mass, wear dress shoes, bring a face mask, use the upper sacristy, and wait for the priest.

## April 11 – Divine Mercy Sunday

During the course of Jesus' revelations to Saint Faustina on the Divine Mercy He asked on numerous occasions that a feast day be dedicated to the Divine Mercy and that this feast be celebrated on the Sunday after Easter. This Feast, which had already been granted to the

nation of Poland and been celebrated within Vatican City, was granted to the Universal Church by Pope John Paul II on the occasion of the canonization of Sr. Faustina in 2000. The Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments stated that "throughout the world the Second Sunday of Easter will receive the name Divine Mercy Sunday, a perennial invitation to the Christian world to face, with confidence in divine benevolence, the difficulties and trials that mankind will experience in the years to come."

## Gospel Commentary for Divine Mercy Sunday: Paschal Mercy

Each year, when the Easter festivities arrive, we welcome with joy the end of our Lenten fasting, and in welcoming the Lord's Resurrection, we welcome back all the things we had given up. It's certainly an annual relief, but it can be followed by a strange sort of torpor and listlessness in our spiritual lives, an Easter doldrums. Part of this comes from the fact that while we have plenty of experience living a worldly, human life, surrounded by weakness, sin, and difficulty, we have no experience yet of living the Lord's own risen life; Easter is an essentially unfamiliar reality for us. Part of the Easter doldrums comes from the fact that it also doesn't carry the same programmatic discipline that Lent does. We know that we are to fast and give things up during Lent, but how do we observe the Easter season once Easter Mass and dinner is finished? We understand the penitential season, but have trouble with the joyful one. This year, by carefully reading the Gospels the Church gives us during this season, let's ask Christ to instruct us in how we are to live these holiest days

This first Sunday after Easter, the second of the season we read as Christ appears to His disciples as a group for the first time since the Resurrection. In fact, for all but Peter and John, this is the first time the Apostles have seen Jesus since Holy Thursday night in the Garden of Gethsemane. Knowing that they had betrayed their friend and master on that painful night, the Apostles could have expected anger, a chastisement, a scolding from the Lord, but instead, He offers them peace. He enters the room, says "peace be with you," and gives them the power to forgive sins. In this moment, not only does Jesus refuse to chastise His disciples for their failings, not only does He forgive them, but He gives them the power, and therefore the mission, of forgiving the sins of others. Jesus demonstrates here that nothing can change the love He has for His disciples, a love that is now seen to be stronger than death itself.

It is this act of mercy that makes the second Sunday of Easter well-suited to be, as Pope St. John Paul II declared it, Divine Mercy Sunday. It teaches us that there is no sin so grave, no fall so far, as to be beyond Christ's ability to heal and restore. On this day, we pray in particular for those who need this truth the most: grave sinners, the lukewarm, the despairing, the troubled. We offer these people to the Sacred Heart of Jesus that He might enlighten and embrace them, and so that all of us together might praise the infinite compassion of our God. Christ has conquered death and sin by His resurrection, so now, no darkness can conquer the hearts of those who reach out to Him.

This then, is our first Easter practice: to ask forgiveness for our sins, and forgive the sins of others. This season, let's begin our intentional observance by receiving the gift of the Lord's risen life by seeking His mercy, and then passing it on to those in need around us. Doing so not only heals our own souls, but makes it possible for us to imitate the Lord mostly closely, and spread His victory and its consequences further into a world that needs that great gift.

## 11 de abril- Divina Misericordia

Durante el transcurso de las revelaciones de Jesús a Santa Faustina sobre la Divina Misericordia pidió en numerosas ocasiones que se dedicara un día de fiesta a la Divina Misericordia y que esta fiesta se celebrara el domingo después de Pascua.
