Pastor's Letter

The Great Mysteries of our Faith

Not many Catholic Schools have the Pastor teaching the students in the classroom. Not many Catholic Middle Schools have a Doctor in Theology teaching the students. Rather, these things would seem quite unusual. Well, both happened this week at Queen of Apostles. Perhaps for the students it was special: "Hey, Fr. Leopoldo is teaching religion this week." But it seemed normal, not a big deal.

Something else that seems normal - preparing for next school year: recruiting students, budgeting, hiring teachers... But I can tell you these annual rhythms are not to be taken for granted. Our school, our faculty, our students... Boy! Each year is a new horizon. I would say that each year is quite unusual. We should have more pride and gratitude for the unique successes of each school year.

Turning to our liturgy, again we are at Palm Sunday. Again, Holy Week. "Yeah...how exciting..." No! It is not normal! It is a great enormous big, big deal!

The Son of God, "he humbled himself, becoming obedient to death, even death on a cross" (Phil 2:8). That's a big deal. Jesus celebrated the Last Supper, instituted the Sacraments of the Eucharist and Holy Orders. He gave himself totally for us out of love. It is a big deal.

The Son of God dies on a Cross. The Immortal One suffers death. The Almighty is helpless. The one who is Life is dead. The one who defeated Satan's temptations in the desert seems now definitively crushed and defeated.

Again Palm Sunday. Again Holy Week. How do we approach this year's celebration of the great mysteries of our Faith, the Easter Triduum? Don't take it for granted. In this very moment of my life God wants to give a unique grace. He invites me to approach Jesus' cross in a new way, deeper than never before.

There is something new to discover this 2019 Holy Week. Are we equipped to look for this hidden treasure? Is the celebration of the Triduum my focus, the focus of my family?

Let today's Liturgy inspire us. We will reenact his entrance in Jerusalem on Palm Sunday. We will listen to the Passion according to Luke. The special atmosphere of Holy Week will fill the Church and our souls.

May the Lord grant us the grace of entering the Holy Week with the proper dispositions: "Therefore, with all faith and devotion let us commemorate the Lord's entry into the city for our salvation, following in his footsteps, so that, being made by his grace partakers of the Cross, we may have a share also in his Resurrection and in his life."

The Divine Mercy Novena

Jesus asked that the Feast of the Divine Mercy be preceded by a Novena to the Divine Mercy which would begin on Good Friday. He gave St. Faustina an intention to pray for on each day of the Novena, saving for the last day the most difficult intention of all, the lukewarm and indifferent of whom He said:

"These souls cause Me more suffering than any others; it was from such souls that My soul felt the most revulsion in the Garden of Olives. It was on their account that I said: 'My Father, if it is possible, let this cup pass Me by.' The last hope of salvation for them is to flee to My Mercy."

In her diary, St. Faustina wrote that Jesus told her:

"On each day of the novena you will bring to My heart a different group of souls and you will immerse them in this ocean of My mercy ... On each day you will beg My Father, on the strength of My passion, for the graces for these souls."

The different souls prayed for on each day of the novena are:

- DAY 1 (Good Friday) - All mankind, especially sinners
- DAY 2 (Holy Saturday) - The souls of priests and religious
- DAY 3 (Easter Sunday) - All devout and faithful souls
- DAY 4 (Easter Monday) - Those who do not believe in Jesus and those who do not yet know Him
- DAY 5 (Easter Tuesday) - The souls of separated brethren
- DAY 6 (Easter Wednesday) - The meek and humble souls and the souls of children
- DAY 7 (Easter Thursday) - The souls who especially venerate and glorify Jesus' mercy
- DAY 8 (Easter Friday) - The souls who are detained in purgatory
- DAY 9 (Easter Saturday) - The souls who have become lukewarm

During the Solemn Novena leading to Divine Mercy Sunday, the Chaplet of Divine Mercy should be offered each day for the day's intentions. Novena Pamphlets are available in the church. 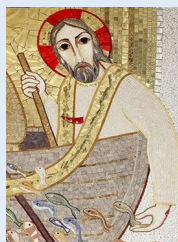

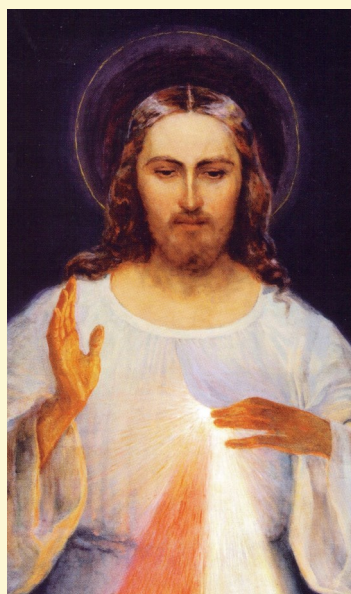

Holy Hour and Eucharistic Exposition on Holy Thursday Night



On this solemn Holy Thursday night (Apr. 18) we invite you to meditate on the Passion of Our Lord and spend some time with Him in prayer.

There will be a Holy Hour at 10 pm and Eucharistic Exposition throughout the night. It will conclude at 11:45 am on Good Friday. Please sign-up by the door of the Chapel.

Fast and Abstinence Everyone over 14 years of age is bound to observe abstinence (no meat) on all Fridays during Lent. On Good Friday, everyone between the ages of 18 and 60 years of age is bound to observe the law of fast. Only one full meatless meal is allowed. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs; but together they should not equal another full meal.

Parish Office Closed The Parish Office will be closed on **Apr. 19** in observance of Good Friday, and **Apr. 22** in observance of Easter.

Bishop's Lenten Appeal As we enter Holy Week, consider making your pledge to the BLA if you haven't already. (222). As a way to live Laudato' Si, and as we enter Holy Week, we are invited to look for ways to use less, to share more, and to focus on relationships instead of things.
