**Religious Education** Religious Education will not meet on **Apr. 21** (Easter Sunday). We wish our Religious Education families and volunteers a prayerful Holy Week and a joyous Easter!

Classes resume on **Apr. 28**.

Religious Education registration for public school and home-school students in kindergarten (age 5) - high school begins on **Apr. 28**. Parents of returning students can pick up the registration form on-site during RE class time. Tuition for parish members is \$70 for 1 child; \$120 for 2 children and \$150 for 3 children in the same family. The tuition payment by cash or check is expected at the time of registration.

Religious Education classes are on Sundays, 9-10:15 am. The first day of class is **Sep. 8**.

Because each year builds on the next year of faith formation, students must attend at least 2 consecutive years of Religious Education before a Sacrament is administered and have no more than three absences during the school year. Generally, baptized children receive First Penance/First Holy Communion in grade 2 and higher and Confirmation is received in grade 8 and higher. A student is show evidence of desire and preparation for a Sacrament. New students need to provide birth and baptismal certificates to register.

## Pastor's Letter

### The Meaning of the Resurrection

Dear Parish Family, Happy Easter!

Today we celebrate the Resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ. All the season of Lent has been the preparation for this great solemnity. During Lent we have considered the meaning of Baptism as a Passover from the Old Adam to the New Adam. Today I would like to continue with the same approach and reflect on the Resurrection as a transformation.

Through Baptism we become part of Jesus' Paschal Mystery: "We were indeed buried with him through baptism into death, so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might live in newness of life" (Rom 6:4).

Jesus, the Son of God, has brought humanity to perfect obedience to the Father. His sacrifice redeems us. And being the first born of a new humanity, in his Resurrection Jesus' humanity is filled with God's glory. This is a new beginning for all of us because now our humanity can be filled with God's glory. From now on, the story of every human person is called to be this transformation: first in the heart through the transforming grace of Baptism and the other sacraments. Finally, on the last day, through the resurrection of the body as we ratify in the profession of Faith: "I believe in the resurrection of the body."

Therefore, the Paschal Mystery is for us a radical transformation, a new beginning. The outpouring of the Holy Spirit hits our hearts, as he did with Mary and the Apostles. We are introduced into the communion of life and love between the Father and the Son in the same Spirit. This is our new life, and we are called to live accordingly.

We already have the life of heaven: communion with God. In Heaven it will also transform our flesh through the resurrection. But the main gift, sharing in God's life is already there through Baptism. And all the other sacraments renew that gift.

This is the great gift God has given us. I know that being holy is not that easy, and that we still suffer the weaknesses of the flesh and the consequences of Original Sin. But this should not become an excuse. God's power is infinite. He can free us from the slavery of sin. But we need to work for it. That was the effort of Lent: to break the slavery to sin in which we were. So now in Easter we will fully live this gift of Christ's life given to us.

If it is not happening this way in our own lives, what has to change?



### Divine Mercy Sunday

Next Sunday, **April 28** the Church celebrates Divine Mercy Sunday. In honor of this special Feast, the Adoration Chapel will be open from 8:30 am to 1 pm. At 1 pm, the Blessed Sacrament will return to the church where the Divine Mercy Chaplet will be prayed. Benediction and Reposition of the Blessed Sacrament will follow.

*"My daughter, tell the whole world about My inconceivable mercy. I desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and a shelter for all souls, and especially for poor sinners. On that day the very depths of My tender mercy are open. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the fount of My mercy. The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment. On that day are opened all the divine floodgates through which graces flow. Let no soul fear to draw near to Me, even though its sins be as scarlet. My mercy is so great that no mind, be it of man or of angel, will be able to fathom it throughout all eternity. Everything that exists has come from the very depths of My most tender mercy. Every soul in its relation to Me will contemplate My love and mercy throughout eternity. The Feast of Mercy emerged from My very depths of tenderness. It is My desire that it be solemnly celebrated on the first Sunday after Easter. Mankind will not have peace until it turns to the Fount of My mercy."*


