Religious Education Religious Education classes resume on **Apr. 28**. The last day of Religious Education is **Jun. 2**.

Religious Education registration for public school and home-school students in kindergarten (age 5) - high school begins on **Apr. 28**. Parents of returning students can pick up the registration form on-site during RE class time. Tuition for parish members is \$70 for 1 child; \$120 for 2 children and \$150 for 3 children in the same family. The tuition payment by cash or check is expected at the time of registration.

Religious Education classes are on Sundays, 9-10:15 am. The first day of class is **Sep. 8**. Because each year builds on the next year of faith formation, students must attend at least 2 consecutive years of Religious Education before a Sacrament is administered and have no more than three absences during the school year. Generally, baptized children receive First Penance/First Holy Communion in grade 2 and higher and Confirmation is received in grade 8 and higher. A student is show evidence of desire and preparation for a Sacrament. New students need to provide birth and baptismal certificates to register.

Confirmation: Rehearsal for all Confirmation students and their sponsors is Friday, **May 10** at 6:30pm in the church. Following the rehearsal white garments that are to be worn by students during Confirmation will be distributed. Information about dress and photography is provided on pages 18-20 of the Confirmation packet. Per Diocesan guidelines, there will be no photography/video during the Confirmation Liturgy.

Confirmation is on Monday, **May 13** at 7 pm. Students, wearing their white garment, are to meet in Hannan Hall by 6 pm. Sponsors are to meet at 6:15 pm in the School Library with the Master of Ceremonies. Parents and guests may find designated seats in in the church. Students and sponsors are to go to Confession before **May 13**.

First Holy Communion: Rehearsal for School and Religious Education students attending the **May 18** Mass in English is Tuesday, **May 14** at 6:30 pm in the church

Rehearsal for students Religious Education students attending the **May 18** Mass in Spanish is Friday, **May 17** at 6:30 pm in the church. Students are to go to Confession before **May 18**.

Information about First Holy Communion dress and photography has been distributed.

Pastor's Letter

The Heart of the Redeemer

Today is Divine Mercy Sunday. For eight days – “octave” – we have celebrated Jesus’ resurrection. For eight days we have been in the upper room with Mary and the apostles debriefing the events of the Easter Triduum. Thomas was not there when Jesus came on Easter Evening.

“Now a week later his disciples were again inside and Thomas was with them” (Jn 20:26). Maybe Thomas went too far asking to put his hand into Jesus’ pierced side. However, Jesus conceded. Jesus wanted Thomas inside his heart, and invited him in.

Two events today reveal Jesus’ mercy. First: the forgiveness of sins: “Receive the holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained” (Jn 20:22-23). Second, his patience with Thomas agreeing to his request.

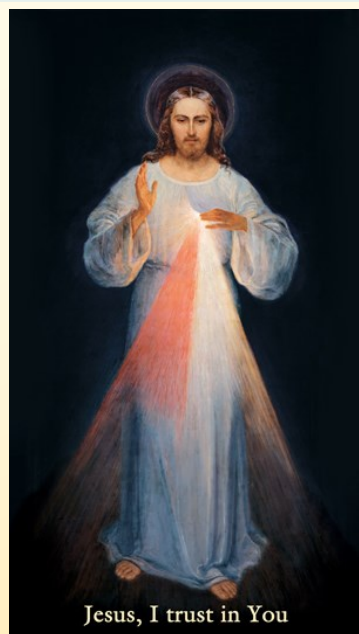
Christian art has represented in many beautiful ways this moment between Jesus and Thomas. Jesus wants Thomas not only to put his hand in his side, but to enter his heart, the heart of the Redeemer. And what do we find there?

First, we find God’s love. Jesus is the Son of God, and came to reveal us God’s love. This is what we find first of all when we approach Jesus’ Heart: “For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son” (Jn 3:16).

Second, we find Jesus’ love of the Father. The one who is God from God and light from light loves the Father with a human heart. And this is something we only understand in prayer. What a great mystery of mercy. God the Father wants the love of a human heart. And Jesus’ heart is totally human loving him with a perfect love, the love of the only begotten Son. God so loved us that he wanted the Incarnation so that a human heart would love him in a perfect way. And we are invited to share that love which is simultaneously divine and human. And Jesus’ love was perfected in his obedience to the Father even to die on the cross.

Finally, we discover Jesus’ love for us. “As the Father loves me, so I also love you. Remain in my love” (Jn 15:9). We encounter Jesus’ heart in the Eucharist, which is a heart filled with a personal and unique love for me. A love that is divine and also human so that we can understand it. We know what is a heart in the fire of love; we have experienced in our hearts joy, sadness, pity, solitude, gratitude... And Jesus’ heart talks to us with this language.

This love of the Heart of the Redeemer is a merciful love. This means not only forgiveness. He also restores us to holiness. He says: “Go, and from now on do not sin any more” (Jn 8:11). That is the almighty word which created heaven and earth. He does not bargain with our sins or weaknesses. He transforms us and breaks the power of sin in us.



Divine Mercy Sunday

This Sunday, the Church celebrates Divine Mercy Sunday.

In honor of this special Feast, the Adoration Chapel will be open from 8:30 am to 1 pm. At 1 pm, the Blessed Sacrament will return to the church where the Divine Mercy Chaplet will be prayed. Benediction and Reposition of the Blessed Sacrament will follow.

“My daughter, tell the whole world about My inconceivable mercy.

I desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and a shelter for all souls, and especially for poor sinners. On that day the very depths of My tender mercy are open.

I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the fount of My mercy.

The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment. On that day are opened all the divine floodgates through which graces flow. Let no soul fear to draw near to Me, even though its sins be as scarlet.

My mercy is so great that no mind, be it of man or of angel, will be able to fathom it throughout all eternity. Everything that exists has come from the very depths of My most tender mercy.

Every soul in its relation to Me will contemplate My love and mercy throughout eternity.

The Feast of Mercy emerged from My very depths of tenderness.

It is My desire that it be solemnly celebrated on the first Sunday after Easter.

Mankind will not have peace until it turns to the Fount of My mercy.”

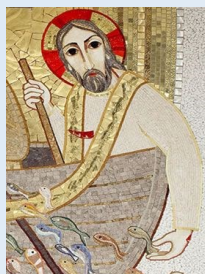

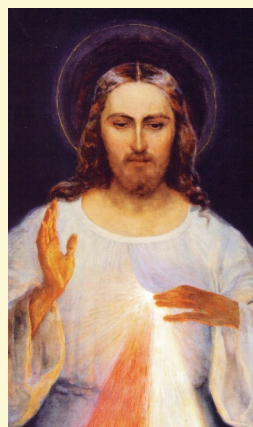
