Next weekend's collection will go toward **Christ House**. **Religious Education** Registration for the **2018-2019** Religious Education school year is open to students in kindergarten (age 5) through high school. Classes meet on Sundays, 9:00-10:15 am in the School, **Sep.-Jun**.

Because each year builds on the next year of faith formation, students must attend at least 2 consecutive years of Religious Education before a Sacrament is administered and have no more than three absences in the school year. A student is to show evidence of desire and preparation for a Sacrament. Generally, First Penance/First Holy Communion is received in grade 2 and higher. Confirmation is received in grade 8 and higher. Parish and returning families are given priority in Religious Education enrollment.

Registration forms are available on Sunday mornings or from the parish office. New students need to provide birth and baptismal certificates. Tuition may be paid by check or cash. Thank you for considering the Religious Education Program at Queen of Apostles.

Families with unbaptized children who are under the age of 7 years old should contact the parish office to make arrangements for baptism.

On Monday, **May 7** at 6:30 pm, there is a mandatory practice in the church for School and Religious Education students and parents attending the **May 12** First Holy Communion Mass in English. On Friday, **May 11** at 6:30 pm, there is a mandatory practice in the church for Religious Education students and parents attending the **May 12** Mass in Spanish.

RCIA Classes in English and Spanish For adults enrolled in the current RCIA school year, the last days of class are Jun. 4 (English) and Jun. 6 (Spanish).

Pastor's Letter

In the Light Of the Master

As we move forward in the Eastertide we continue reading St. John's Gospel. Today is the allegory of the vine and the branches, "I am the true vine, and my Father is the vine grower. He takes away every branch in me that does not bear fruit, and every one that does he prunes so that it bears more fruit [...] I am the vine, you are the branches. Whoever remains in me and I in him will bear much fruit, because without me you can do nothing..." (Jn 15:1-8).

How can we remain in Christ? It is again St. John: "Those who keep his commandments remain in him, and he in them" (1 Jn 3:24). To remain in Christ is more than love God above all. It is also to love neighbor. "Children, let us love

not in word or speech but in deed and truth" (1 Jn 3:18).

This Sunday's readings introduce us in Pope Francis' third chapter of *Gaudete et Exultate* (Rejoice and Be Glad). Entitled "In the Light Of the Master", the pope explains how to love in deed and truth: the beatitudes and the works of mercy.

In the words of St. John Paul the Great, "The Beatitudes are not specifically concerned with certain particular rules of behavior. Rather, they speak of basic attitudes and dispositions in life... their originality and profundity they are a sort of self- portrait of Christ, and for this very reason are invitations to discipleship and to communion of life with Christ" (Veritatis Splendor 16).

Pope Francis will offer a brief comment on the eight beatitudes, reminding us that "they clearly run counter to the way things are usually done in our world. Even if we find Jesus' message attractive, the world pushes us towards another way of living" (GE 65). If we follow Jesus, we go "against the flow" (GE 65).

After discussing the beatitudes he goes to the final judgement (Mt 25:35-36): "If we seek the holiness pleasing to God's eyes, this text offers us one clear criterion on which we will be judged. 'I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me drink..." (GE 95).

He finishes the chapter reminding us of the risk of the media alienating us from others and the saint's testimony: "When we allow ourselves to be caught up in superficial information, instant communication and virtual reality, we can waste precious time and become indifferent to the suffering flesh of our brothers and sisters [...] The powerful witness of the saints is revealed in their lives, shaped by the Beatitudes and the criterion of the final judgement. Jesus' words are few and straightforward, yet practical and valid for everyone, for Christianity is meant above all to be put into practice" (GE 108-109).

Rule of Life: Sanctifying Ordinary Work

Sanctifying one's work is no fantastic dream, but the mission of every Christian – yours and mine. –That is what that lathe-worker had discovered, when he said: "I am overwhelmed with happiness when I think how true it is that while I am working at the lathe and singing – singing all the time, on the outside and on the inside – I can become a saint. How good God is!" (St. Josemaría Escrivá, Furrow #517).

Practices to Sanctifying your ordinary work:

- [†] **Include intentionally your work in your morning offering and in your bedtime prayer.** In the morning, to offer it up to God and to ask for his blessing so you do a good work. In the night, to give thanks for the fruit or your work and to ask forgiveness for your shortcomings.
- * "Remember the Sabbath day, to keep it holy" (Ex 20:8). On Sunday, give thanks for the work of the week and the good you've done, as you rest and celebrate it.
- [†] Weekly, set aside for God your first work hour's income. Give it to offer a Mass, Charities, offertory...
- [†] When you arrive home after work, give thanks to God for one thing you have achieved and share it with your family while saying grace over dinner or family night prayer.
