Pastor's Letter

1st Sunday of Advent. It's Coming!

After the Solemnity of Christ the King, we start a new Liturgical Year and the Advent Season. Jesus' coming and our need to prepare for it is this season's focus.

The coming of the Son of Man is the fulfillment of God's promises: "The days are coming –oracle of the LORD–when I will fulfill the promise I made to the house of Israel and the house of Judah" (Jer 33:14).

Thus Advent season calls us to be vigilant and to conduct ourselves in a way pleasing to God: "Beware that your hearts do not become drowsy from carousing and drunkenness and the anxieties of daily life, and that day catch you by surprise" (Lk 21:34). "We earnestly ask and exhort you in the Lord Jesus that, as you received from us how you should conduct yourselves to please God" (1 Tes 4:1).

But let me make a tricky maneuver. It's coming. The Son of Man. Christmas. The new year. And also a Capital Campaign! Yes, it's coming.

We are about to finalize the first phase of the Capital Campaign, which is a preliminary study to help set a prudent goal and the best strategy. The survey I asked you to fill is part of that study, in addition to a series of interviews with parishioners representing our diverse parish family. One of the concerns which was raised in the responses was the need for transparency and better communication.

Further to this effort I would like to give you some updates. All the parish projects are supervised and managed by the Office of Facilities, Planning and Construction of the Diocese of Arlington. At this point they and we are ready to sign the contracts for the renovations to the new house on Applegarth Ct. and for a new organ. Hopefully our current organ will stretch a little more and be operative until Holy Week 2019.

But my point today is not about projects and fundraising. Why do we run a Capital Campaign? Why do we ask you for an extra sacrificial offering? Certainly there are needs in the Parish, and these needs require extra financial efforts in cycles of 10, 20 and 30 years, as our own history has shown. So as our Parish approaches 60 years, we have the "perfect opportunity" (I prefer this word rather than "perfect storm").

Yes, a perfect opportunity. Because it is not only nor mainly about our facilities. It is about our growth and holiness. The Capital Campaign is coming. But above all, the Son of Man is coming. And we want to respond to his call to be alert and not grow drowsy. We are working for God's glory, to prepare a place for the one who is coming. We are taking ownership of what the first generation of parishioners build for us to enjoy today and preparing to pass it on the coming generations of parishioners.

Any time we come to the parish for Mass, Sacraments, paperwork in the Rectory Office... we are enjoying what others generously provided for us. Let's live in spirit of gratitude and prepare for the one who is coming. Not the Capital Campaign, but Jesus Christ, the King of the Universe.

Be Aware of Email Scams Recently, several parishioners received an email that appeared to be coming from the parish office but which was actually sent from a fraudulent email address. The fraudulent sender asked the recipient for gift cards to be purchased, and for the gift card numbers to be emailed back to them. This was a scam. Always check that parish emails, especially those requesting support, were sent from users on our web domain: [name]@queenofapostles.org. Many email providers, such as Gmail, sometimes only show the name of the sender and not the actual email address from which it was sent. In the case of this scam, the name showed "Leopoldo M. Vives" but the email address was not from our domain. If you are concerned you may have been the recipient of a fraudulent email, please call the parish office or email general@queenofapostles.org to let us know. Also, be sure to report the fraudulent email to your email provider (Yahoo, Gmail, etc).
