A: Yes. Both Sunday and Christmas are Holy Days of Obligation. For this year, the faithful have two Mass obligations: the Fourth Sunday of Advent (**December 23/24**), and Christmas (**December 24/25**) which will need to be fulfilled by their partici-

Q: How can we fulfill our Holy Day obligations? A: We have six options. Come to Mass:

- (1) Saturday pm & Sunday pm (Christmas Eve)
- (2) Saturday pm & Monday am (Christmas Day)
- (3) Saturday pm & Monday pm (Christmas Day)
- (4) Sunday am & Sunday pm (Christmas Day)
- (5) Sunday am & Monday am (Christmas Day)
- (6) Sunday am & Monday pm (Christmas Day)
