

Pastor's Letter

Our parish family finds life and nourishment in the sacraments. Moreover, as the Catechism says, the Eucharist is the source and summit of our life. Last week and this coming week are both perfect examples of this.

As you may recall, last Tuesday we celebrated Our Lady of Lourdes, which coincides with the World Day of the Sick. Pope John Paul II, upon instituting this feast, reflected:

Outside of faith...how can we discover in the moment of trial the constructive contribution of pain? How can we give meaning and value to the anguish, unease, and physical and psychic ills accompanying our mortal condition?...Yes, only in Christ, the incarnate Word, Redeemer of mankind and victor over death, is it possible to find satisfactory answers to such fundamental questions.

We announced that we would offer the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick during the Mass. We had an incredible turnout! While we did not count, I estimated about 45 people who came seeking this powerful sacrament. We plan to do this twice a year: on February 11 (Our Lady of Lourdes) and on September 15 (Our Lady of Sorrows).


On Thursday, we held a Holy Hour dedicated to Married and Engaged Couples. It took place during our normal Holy Hour time slot, from 7:30PM to 8:30PM. (You are welcome to join us each week! We offer confessions during that time.) This week was National Marriage Week, so what better way to celebrate marriage than with Jesus, who instituted it as a sacrament. There was an opportunity for praise and worship. The highlight was the moment when our married couples were able to renew their vows in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament. We had a short reflection and we also came together to offer our prayers for those preparing for marriage and for those marriages that are struggling. The Holy Hour was followed by a beautiful reception in the vestibule. Thanks to all those who helped make this special moment possible.

This week again we will gather around the Blessed Sacrament. I would like to invite our parishioners to make Thursday, February 20, a very special day to come together as a parish family to present our petitions to the Lord. I'm asking that we (or those who can) fast on bread and water for that day and attend the Holy Hour at 7:30 PM. During the Holy Hour we will pray the holy rosary together for three very concrete intentions: 1) the holiness of our priests and in reparation for their sins; 2) the sanctity of marriage and family; 3) the end of violence. I do hope that many of our parishioners will join us. Even if you cannot physically be present, please pray for these intentions. What power in a family that prays together! Remember what we have always heard: a family that prays together, stays together. I hope to see you there.

Update on the Adoration Chapel

Have you had an opportunity to make a quick visit to the Adoration Chapel? We continue to celebrate the 10th Anniversary of the gift of our Adoration Chapel. Thanks to a generous benefactor, we were able to replace the carpet last weekend. And thanks to our volunteers who removed the pews and put them back (not as easy as it may seem!), we have also repainted the Chapel. Without the pews, it was evident that the walls needed a fresh coat of paint, so they volunteered to take care of it the next day. It is very moving to see how the Lord in the Eucharist brings us together as a family and moves us to want to serve him and our parish family.




