PASTOR'S LETTER

Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

We have started the season of Lent, a wonderful time within the liturgical calendar that invites us to meditate on our conversion through sacrifice and mortification, prayer and the most direct and profound contact with God, and almsgiving, a sign of detachment from the material, sharing what little we have with those most in need. Each Lent is different because each year, the Lord invites us to enter the desert differently, with other challenges and purposes. For this reason, each one must take this time seriously and personally and thus achieve more spiritual fruits, which lead us to live the celebration of the Paschal Mysteries in grace and holiness as it should be.

Being already in this extraordinary time, I want to invite those who have been absent from participating in Masses and the parish life for a while now. It is time to return, do not be afraid of contagion (as I have already explained in previous letters), in our parish we follow the safety protocols very strictly and I think there is no reason to be afraid, return home, your house, the house of the Lord. He awaits you to be your food; there is nothing more extraordinary than to receive His body and His blood and above all receive His grace through the sacraments. I invite you to meditate and keep it in your prayers. We hope you decide to come back soon.

I remind you that every Friday, we will have the prayer of the Stations of the Cross in English at 5:30 pm and in Spanish at 7:30 pm and the days of confessions that everyone already knows, and during Lent, we will hear confessions on Wednesdays at 6:30pm, I invite you to take the opportunity and make a good confession.


We have already started with the remodeling of the confessionals. I hope that by mid-March they will be ready and we can use them. I know that it is a bit uncomfortable for both you and us due to the limited space, but this will be solved soon. Thank you very much to those who are collaborating with our Capital Campaign because thanks to you these projects are being carried out gradually, and the sanctuary is taking on more life.

Finally, we are almost complete with the projects that the diocese asked us to do in the office and the parking lot. In the office, there is a wall of protection for the staff's safety; thank God this week it will be finished. I thank you for your support and understanding, and in the parking lot the installation of security cameras, this to control what happens in the parking lot, both in the hours when the children are at school and night, at least now we will have a little more control, and we will know if something happens.

I hope that you live this Lent with faith and with great intensity, putting into practice prayer, fasting, and almsgiving and that we can prepare the celebration of Easter.

Religious Education Information

Classes resume **February 21** with doors opening at 8:30am. Students in all grades were sent homework to complete for the February 21 class.

We follow Fairfax County Public Schools on closures related to snowy weather.

Desiring and prepared Confirmation students in grade 8-high school and his/her sponsor are to attend the *mandatory* rehearsal - rescheduled for Sunday, February 21 at 6pm in the church. After the rehearsal, the white garment will be distributed to the students. The Confirmation Liturgy is on Monday, February 22, 2021 at 7pm in Queen of Apostles Church with Bishop Burbidge. Students and sponsors are to arrive by 6:15pm in Hannan Hall. Students are to wear his/her Confirmation garment over dress clothes. To comply with safety protocols, everyone must wear face masks and observe physical distancing. We ask that immediate family members only attend the Confirmation liturgy. Students continue to attend RE classes through the end of the school year.

Please pray for our 35 students that they may sincerely and intentionally receive the Sacrament of Confirmation.

First Penance for School students is scheduled for **February 25 at 10am**. School families should confirm the information with the school teacher. First Penance for RE students is scheduled for **Saturday**, **February 27**, **2021 at 9:30am in the church**. Let us pray for our parish's young people as they prepare for this lifelong Sacrament of Healing.

Students desiring and preparing for the Sacraments of Initiation are to attend The Rite of Election with his/her sponsor on **Sunday, February 21, 2021, 3pm at the Cathedral of St. Thomas More.** Please arrive no later than 2:30pm. This is not a Mass. *Only catechumens and sponsors may attend*. Scrutinies are scheduled for March 7, 14, 21 during the 12 noon Mass.

One of the chairs is referred to about 600 by an Abbot Johannes who had been commissioned by Pope Gregory the Great to collect in oil from the lamps which burned at the graves of the Roman martyrs.

Gospel Commentary by Fr. Joseph Rampino for First Sunday of Lent:

True Repentance

As this holy season of Lent begins, Jesus calls each of us to true repentance, repenting with our whole heart. It is, of course, important for us to understand as we seek to live up to His call, just what it is he means by repentance, as well as what He does not mean. Sometimes it can be easier to understand our goal by making clear what answers miss the mark.

Repentance is, first and foremost, not simply an act of guilt or self-hatred for our sins before God. While we should recall our sins as part of repentance, God is not asking us just to feel awful about the things that we've done and seek self-punishment or condemnation. Christ has already undergone the sacrifice that heals the wounds of sin once for all on the Cross, and does not need us to subject ourselves to grief in order to pay for our sins a second time. We do not repent in order to beat ourselves up for sin.

Repentance is also not a grand self-improvement project in the name of our holy Faith. We do not turn away from our sins and failings out of a mere desire to be better, to improve in personal discipline, to become the sort of person we would rather be, so that we can face ourselves and God with greater calm and self-confidence. While it is, of course, a good thing to grow in self-control and to build virtue on a natural level, no amount of personal perfection could ever gain for us the right to speak with God at all, much less as a friend, much less forever in heaven. We do not repent to make ourselves better by our own efforts.

These two forms of false or incomplete repentance miss the mark because they are focused on us, ourselves. Whether based on servile fear and self-condemnation, or on pride and a desire for self-confidence, both find root in the self. True repentance, on the other hand, is a response of love to God's love for us. We repent because we understand that we have been loved, and we wish to love more and more in return. The word "repent" itself means to turn back, and so implies that we have someone to whom we are turning back. That someone is the God who created us, loved us enough to rescue us from ourselves, and who desires to bring us into His own inner life in heaven. We turn away from our sins so that we are free of obstacles in loving Him back. We take on disciplines so that we can more and more clearly see Him, and desire with greater fervor to be with Him. Everything that we do in the process of repentance comes from this desire to be close to the God whose love goes before us, at whatever cost.

Indeed, repentance, far from a purely painful or sacrificial process, is a moment of tremendous joy in the Christian life. The gift of holy tears that often accompanies deep repentance comes not only from sorrow over sin, but rather from the realization of how overwhelmingly we have been loved, in the midst of, and despite our sinfulness. This year, as we carry so much trouble and fear from the past months to the feet of our God, I hope we will see that in each of our trials as well, we have been loved totally, and never abandoned. While we may very well be moved to weep over our sins, we do so out of joy and hope. While we may fast and discipline our bodies and minds, we do so with love for Him who made and saved us. The purpose of all our repentance is not anything in us, in ourselves, but rather is Christ Jesus and the glory He offers in calling us out of darkness into His marvelous light.

With these things in mind, we can more easily and with greater fervor dedicate ourselves this Lent to the great work of repentance. If we open our souls in this way to the love of God, surely we will find whatever strengthening, encouragement, and healing we need in Christ who willingly suffers for us, and who out of love will rise to new, glorious, and unconquerable life.
