Sacraments of Initiation - RCIA (adults) and Religious Education (students) On the third, fourth, and fifth Sundays of Lent, special Rites call Scrutinies take place during Mass. Students and adults, accompanied by their godparents/sponsors, who desire the Sacraments of Initiation are to attend.

The scrutinies are meant to uncover, and then heal all that is weak, defective, or sinful in the hearts of the elect; to bring out, then strengthen all that is upright, strong, and good. For the scrutinies are celebrated in order to deliver the elect from the power of sin and Satan, to protect them against temptation, and to give them strength in Christ, who is the way, the truth, and the life. These rites, therefore, should complete the conversion of the elect and deepen their resolve to hold fast to Christ and to carry out their decision to love God above all. (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults, 141)

The First Scrutiny and Presentation of the Creed is scheduled during Masses on **Mar. 3, 4**: RCIA-Spanish 7:00 pm on **Mar. 3** and RE students and RCIA-English 10:30 am on **Mar. 4**. The Elect, formerly known as catechumens, and their godparents, are expected to participate. Adult candidates and their sponsors are encouraged to attend.

**Nazareth** Girls and boys in grades 5-8 are invited to join Nazareth. Generally, Nazareth is held on the 1st and 3rd Fridays of the month. Nazareth will be held on **Mar. 2, 16**. #### Pastor's Letter

#### The Transfiguration

Last week we reflected on the sacraments as a new beginning. The mystery we contemplate today shows that the transformation the sacraments act in us is not something merely spiritual, but a transformation of the whole human person which, though already started, is still a work in progress.

Since Descartes in the 17<sup>th</sup> century, our culture has broken the "substantial unity" of body and soul. The human person has different dimensions: body, affections, emotions, memory, intelligence, and will. All of them constitute the richness of the human person in its complexity but also in its unity. Body and soul are not different realms. Matter and spirit are not disjointed. We are not a broken being yearning for an impossible unity.

The transfiguration of the Lord shows how humanity is a revelation of God's glory. As the body is the visibility of the person, in Jesus' body the glory of the divine person is made visible anticipating the glory of his and our resurrection.

Jesus' human body is not different from ours. And the glory of our body in the resurrection will not be different than Jesus'. This is what we state in the Creed: "I believe in the resurrection of the body." Thus the Church asks to bury the ashes of the deceased, because they are the remains of a body which is called to the resurrection. To spread them does not fit with our faith in the resurrection.

The glory of the resurrection is the end of the human person's journey. We will be risen like Christ and share in his glory. Now, Baptism is the beginning of this transformation. Thus we say that Baptism is a new beginning. And rightly so. Baptism makes us children of God. This new fatherhood brings a new identity and a new net of relationships, a new life not only for the soul, but also for the body. Indeed all of our choices, actions and relationships happen through and in our bodies. We bear in our bodies the glory of God and we are being transformed, little by little, both in body and soul, until God's glory will fully shine in our resurrection.

The Transfiguration is not only something that happens to Jesus. It happens to me. And it happens because of the sacraments. Baptism is a new beginning for me, body, affections, and spirit... Something totally new has happened in me, and the sacraments continue that work of transformation.

If my body bears the glory of God, holiness is the natural consequence of Baptism. Let us pursue holiness intently in this time of Lent.
