PASTOR'S LETTER

Dear brothers and sisters:

We are celebrating the Second Sunday in Ordinary Time. This time is called the time of hope, which is why the priest dresses in green. This Sunday, John the Baptist solemnly shows us how to follow the Lamb of God, the one who takes away the sins of the world; with this, John invites us not to remain stagnant but to look to the Lord and not to lose heart. Precisely today more than ever, we need to put our gaze on Jesus so that this strong storm that we are going through right now smoothes and becomes less dark. Let us not get tired of following the Lamb of God through sacramental life and personal prayer.


As you know, the pandemic has hurt in all aspects, one of them being economical. Our school is not financially well, and the parish is also a bit tight in its budget. To solve this situation a bit, I have decided to host a parish car raffle. In previous years, we joined this activity through All Saints parish, but the profit received was minimal, and it was mostly used in the administrative part of this activity. We researched and discovered that we could gain more if we do a raffle just for the parish. The school and the parish will work together, and the profit will be divided between the school and the parish. I want to ask if one of you knows someone who will be willing to donate a new car for the raffle or that knows/has contact with a car dealer that can give us a car at least at half price or with a good discount. This would help us to have a better profit. If someone wants to support us with the raffle, I ask that you please contact me directly or contact the parish office as soon as possible to start these procedures. The idea is to hold the raffle in June of this year.

Also, at the end of the month, the March for Life will take place. I know that the pro-life committee is preparing for it, but as we already know, this year, everything is different. It is crucial to support this movement, but we must also be clear that it is somewhat dangerous. That day, we will expose the Most Holy Sacrament all day, and we will pray for life and the end of abortion. I invite you to come and spend time in prayer in our sanctuary with Jesus as your way of supporting this activity. However, if someone wants more information about the March, I ask you to contact Larry Cirignano; he will provide you with more details about it.

As you have noticed, we replaced the yellow tape with nice looking white cord for Christmas because many did not like the yellow tape. Unfortunately, the blue masking tape and the tape holding the pew clips need replacement weekly. The tape is destroyed over the weekend because many are not careful or let children play with it. I ask you to please not remove or tear the blue tape because every week we have to change it and it takes hours of work and extra material expenses. Please respect the marked areas; it is for your protection. I'm asking you this out of charity for the many brothers and sisters struggling with this situation.

I hope you have a happy week, and let's continue praying for each other.

The First Penance/First Holy Communion registration form and \$20 fee is due by **Jan 17, 2021** from baptized School and RE students in grades 2 and higher.



Students and sponsors are to attend and sit in the front pews nearest the Presider's Chair.

January 21 - St. Agnes of Rome

St. Agnes (c. 304) is to be numbered among the most famous martyrs of Rome. When the Diocletian persecution was at its height, and when priests as well as laymen were apostatizing from the faith, Agnes, a girl of twelve, freely chose to die for Christ. When she was com-

manded to offer incense to false gods, she raised her hand to Christ and made the Sign of the Cross. When the heathens threatened to bind her, she hastened to the place of torture as a bride to her wedding feast. When the son of the Roman prefect offered to marry her, she said: "The one to whom I am betrothed is Christ Whom the angels serve." When the executioner hesitated, she encouraged him with the words: "Strike, without fear, for the bride does her Spouse an injury if she makes Him wait".

Gospel Commentary for the Second Sunday in Ordinary Time: The More Important Answer

"Come, and you will see." Christ's words to Andrew and John today in the Gospel both show us the way God likes to build friendships with those whom He loves, and call us to respond in some practical way to His invitation.

We may notice that when these two former disciples of John the Baptist inquire after Jesus, looking for answers about Him and His life, the Lord does not directly answer them, but draws them first into His company. This is all the more notable since the question they asked Him was a simple one: where are you staying? Given His answer, Jesus is clearly not interested in simply conveying information, but rather in letting these disciples meet Him and spend time in His presence. He longs to teach them experientially who He really is, and clearly, even an afternoon is enough to convince them of what they later tell Peter: "we have found the Messiah." Christ knows the hearts of Andrew and John, and seeing clearly the desire for God, He gives them far more than they ask for, filling them with joy and setting them on the grand mission that will lead to their glorious entrance into Heaven.

Of course, when Christ responds to our questions the way He did to theirs, we might not always react with the same joy. When we have difficulties in our lives, and bring them to Christ, sometimes what we chase is the bare information, or the simple cure. We may come to Christ seeking to understand exactly why something has happened, what we should do about it, or how God is going to fix it. When Christ says to us, just as He did to the first Apostles "come and stay with me," we might not find it comforting in the same way. It takes an act of faith to trust that simply remaining in the presence of the Lord really is the answer to every question and every difficulty. We may seek the immediate and practical solution, but Jesus is always seeking the friendship that is itself the solution.

This should also teach us something about understanding God's will in our lives. Whether in discerning our vocations, or simply trying to see how God wants us to navigate a situation in the lives we already lead, pursuing deeper friendship with the Lord always leads us to the correct answer. God might not give us extraordinary signs in prayer, directing down a certain route, just as He did not give a simple answer to Andrew and John, but He does give the answer by inviting us closer to Himself. If we make our decisions based on whether each route will lead us into deeper love for the Lord and the ones He has given us, we will surely not go astray, and may find that in keeping our eyes focused on Him, the Lord has taken us on an adventure we would never have thought possible had we been told directly.

This week, we ought to make acts of faith and of trust in this God who desires our friendship, so that we might stay faithful to this often unclear, but always sure path until it finds its end in the bright lands of the heavenly kingdom.
