

All cards are faced down, and we take turns reaching out to take a card. Once everyone has a card, we go around and read our card. Many are well-known saints. A few are less well-known. The goal is to learn more about a particular saint throughout the year, to remember our own call to holiness, and to invoke this particular saint's intercession throughout the year. We do this at the beginning of the year, but any day is a good day to adopt a saint. This weekend, we will have a table with many saint cards. Please come take one for yourself or for your family.

For those of you who were unable to attend our 10th Anniversary Mass of Thanksgiving for our Adoration Chapel last Sunday, it was a beautiful celebration.
