Pastor's Letter

A New Teaching with Authority

As we move toward Lent, we are in the early weeks of Ordinary Time. The Sunday readings carry us to the beginnings of Jesus' ministry. In this Fourth Sunday we join the Jewish crowds in their awe, "The people were astonished at his teaching, for he taught them as one having authority and not as the scribes" (Mk 1:22).

Yes. Jesus teaches with authority, He is God "who can neither deceive nor be deceived" (Catechism Cath. Church 156). Following him, embracing his teaching, we are in the light and we have found the way, the truth and the life.

Truth is a great gift which Jesus gave us. The times in which "people might seek God, even perhaps grope for him and find him" (Acts 17:27) are gone. Now the glory of God has shown upon us and in Jesus himself we have contemplated the splendor of truth.

We live in a culture where it is more important to feel well than to be virtuous, where a foggy relativism is preferred to the passion for truth. In this culture this New Teaching with Authority can be unbearable. However, no one would prefer darkness to light, evil to good or fiction to truth. Archbishop Chaput wrote recently: "Briefly put: Truth exists, whether we like it or not. We don't create truth; we find it, and we have no power to change it to our tastes. The truth may not make us comfortable, but it does make us free. And knowing and living the truth ennoble our lives. It is the only path to lasting happiness" (The Splendor of Truth, First Things, Oct. 2017).

This is our joy as Catholics. Light, truth, good, beauty, are given to us in the Gospel, in this New Teaching with Authority. And Jesus endowed the Pope and his Church with this same authority to teach, establishing her as "the pillar and foundation of truth" (1 Tim 3:15).

This summer 2018 we will celebrate three remarkable anniversaries: 50 years of Humanae Vitae; 25 years of Veritatis Splendor; and 20 years of Fides et Ratio. Blessed Paul VI and St. John Paul the Great. The Pope's authority bejeweled with the halo of holiness.

Thank you, Jesus, for giving us the gift of truth which ennobles our lives. Strengthen us to embrace fully the Church's teachings, given us "not to impose a restraint upon you, but for the sake of propriety and adherence to the Lord without distraction" (1 Cor 7:35).

Two examples of a Spiritual Communion:

My Jesus, I believe that you are in the Blessed Sacrament. I love you above all things, and I long for you in my soul. Since I cannot now receive you sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart. As though you have already come, I embrace you and unite myself entirely to you; never permit me to be separated from you. Amen. (St. Alphonsus Liguori)
