PASTOR'S LETTER

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ Jesus.

Grace and peace to all. I hope you are well and that you continue working for the construction of the kingdom of God. Thank God we have already finished the first month of the year 2021—we are hoping that everything will gradually return to normal soon. I continue to ask God that those whom I have not had the pleasure of meeting return soon, and we begin to defeat the pandemic of fear that does not allow us to meet as always. In this Sunday's gospel, Jesus goes to the synagogue to pray and teach, to manifest His divine authority, and to show us that He has come to free us from the attacks and possessions of evil. It is He, who with His infinite power, walks with us and protects us. He encourages us to be confident, not to be dominated by evil. I think that many situations that we experience today are very similar to those that Jesus faced; evil continues to manifest itself in fear, division, and in the double standard of the world. However, there is no need to be afraid because His authority and His love are still current and He will always conquer evil.

We are almost on the verge of starting Lent; in just two weeks, we will celebrate Ash Wednesday, and we are already preparing for it. Please help me prepare the ashes that we will impose on our heads. I know that palms from previous years have always been used to prepare the ashes. If you have blessed palms from previous years, I ask you to bring them to the office this or next week before Lent so we can begin to prepare the ashes. I will inform you later about the activities during this particular time.

As most know, each year before Lent, the Bishop's Lenten Appeal begins. Perhaps, some have already received information in the mail. If you have not received it yet, the diocese will send the information and the envelopes in the mail so that you can make your donations. The Bishop's Lenten Appeal is the primary means of support for many ministries, programs, services, and good works of our faith community throughout the diocese. Supporting the Appeal helps the less fortunate among us, offers spiritual and physical comfort and counseling to those in crisis, and inspires children, young adults, and families to embrace and nurture their Catholic faith. It is a sacrifice that we all make to support this initiative of our bishop. I encourage you to help me reach the goal that has been assigned to us this year.

I also want to invite you to participate in our parish ministries, especially in the lectors' ministry. As you have noticed, almost always we have the same lectors every Sunday. I appreciate their availability and commitment to proclaim the Word every Sunday, but I would like others to commit to helping in this ministry. I invite you to take it to prayer and ask yourself if God is calling you to serve in this ministry. Similarly, the Ushers' ministry needs more hands to exercise their mission, and I hope that before Easter, we can create a welcoming ministry where young adults can also participate. We have much to do, and I hope the Lord moves hearts to commit to working in His vineyard.

Let's keep praying and working to make the kingdom of God among us more prominent and more prosperous.

Religious Education Information

Confirmation students in grade 8-high school are to submit his/her Apostolic Service Hours log and 2-page reflection report by Jan 31, 2021. School students should check with Miss Hang about the deadline. The Confirmation Liturgy is scheduled for Monday, Feb 22, 2021 at 7pm in Queen of Apostles Church for desiring and prepared students attending the School or Religious Education Program. A mandatory rehearsal is scheduled for Friday, Feb 19, 2021 at 6:30pm in the church for students and sponsors. Everyone must wear face masks and observe physical distancing. More information and guidelines will be provided. Students and sponsors should expect to arrive at the church about an hour before the 7pm Liturgy.

The First Penance/First Holy Communion registration form and \$20 fee was due by Jan 17, 2021 from baptized School and RE students in grades 2 and higher. First Penance for School students is scheduled for Feb 25 at 10am. School families should confirm the information with the school teacher. First Penance for RE students is scheduled for Feb 27, 2021 at 9:30am in the church.

The Sacraments of Initiation form and \$50 fee from families with unbaptized children was due Jan 10, 2021. The priest signed and sealed Sponsor Certificate of Eligibility was due Jan 17, 2021. The Rite of Exorcism, Anointing, and Blessing will be held during the 12Noon Mass on Jan 24, 2021 at Queen of Apostles. Students and sponsors are to attend and sit in the front pews nearest the Presider's Chair. The Rite of Election will be held on Sunday, Feb 21, 2021 at the Cathedral of St. Thomas More. Only catechumens and sponsors may attend.

Safety Guidelines





According to the law of Moses, a woman was ritually unclean for 40 days after childbirth. Therefore, Mary and Joseph took Jesus to the Temple to present him to the Lord and offer sacrifice for purification. "... just as it is written in the law of the Lord, 'Every male that opens the womb shall be consecrated to the Lord,' and to offer the sacrifice of 'a pair of turtledoves or two young pigeons..." (Luke 2:23-24)

Gospel Commentary for the Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time: Teaching With Authority

"He taught them as one having authority and not as the scribes." This description of Jesus' teaching today in the Gospel may be a strange one for us to hear. What does it mean for Christ to teach with authority, and why does that astonish the crowds listening to Him as He preaches? What is the difference between the Lord and the scribes and elders that so captivates the people of Capernaum this Sunday? The short answer is that while the scribes would have taught primarily by interpretation, explaining different passages of the Torah, or even famous and accepted opinions on passages of the Torah, Christ taught from His own soul, according to His relationship with the Father. He, like Moses, spoke from His conversations with the God of Israel, rather than on another text.

While in our world, it is common for people to give their own opinions on religious matters, to make decisions and speak to others based on the results of their own personal thinking, this would have been absolutely unacceptable in the ancient world. The only way one was permitted to speak of or teach about God was by permission from God Himself, demonstrated through miracles, or by offering clarity on the already accepted revelation of God. Moses could be the lawgiver of Israel because God spoke to Him directly, and confirmed everything by signs and wonders. The scribes and elders could teach the law of Moses, but they could never give the law as Moses had done. Thus when Christ teaches on His own authority, claiming to speak the word of God to the crowds, it is, at the very least, shocking, or, at the worst, blasphemous and offensive to His listeners. By casting out demons, not only does He free people enslaved to evil, but He demonstrates who He is, that He really does come from the Father, and He is not sent by the evil one as a fraud.

Christ teaches as He does because He is the second person of the Blessed Trinity, the Eternal Word of the Father, and the perfect expression of everything that the Father is. He can teach as He does because He is Truth itself. He has authority to say how things really are because He is the one through whom each and every one of them was made. Thus, everything He tells us is not only true, but the very source of truth, and every teaching of His that comes down to us through the Church is more reliable than the sun or the seasons.

So how do we respond to Christ's teaching? Do we venerate what He tells us? Do we trust it with our whole hearts? Are we glad to have heard it, and proud to pass it on to others? Do we let Christ's truth correct us? Do we ask Him to form us according to the way in which He first desired to make us? Do we ask Him to cast the demons out of our lives, along with all evil, anything that might keep us from fully accepting truth's teaching? If we open our souls in humility to the true authority of Christ, we have nothing to fear. His only desire is our good, and all we will ever lose is the security of our pride. This week, especially as Lent draws near, we should offer our hearts in humility before Christ Jesus once again, asking that our hearts be converted to the vision of the one who sees all, and who alone loves us perfectly.


