Introducing Fr. Jaime de Cendra, DCJM to the Queen of Apostles Family! (Previously announced July 2, 2019)

We were excited to learn recently that another priest of the Disciples will be joining us at Queen of Apostles: Fr. Jaime de Cendra, DCJM, from Spain. Fr. Jaime will serve as part-time Parochial Vicar at our parish - beginning August 1, 2019.

Fr. Jaime was ordained June 28, 2008. He graduated with a law degree from the University of Madrid. Upon graduating, Fr. Jaime entered the community of the Disciples at 21 years old, after World Youth Day in 2000. He went on to complete a theology degree from the Ecclesiastical University San Dámaso in Madrid and a master's degree in philosophy from the Gregorian University of Rome.

After his studies and ordination, Fr. Jaime taught Spanish and Religion at the Disciples' Stella Maris School in Madrid. He then served as Parochial Vicar and School Chaplain at St. Mary in Littleton, Colorado (Archdiocese of Denver) from 2015 to 2018.

"I am excited that Fr. Jaime will be joining us at Queen of Apostles," said Fr. Juan Espino, our newly installed Pastor as of July 1. "I have known him for many years and am confident he will contribute much to the sacramental and ministry life of our parish. In particular, I look forward to his participation in the school."

Religious Education: Faith Formation for Children

Religious Education classes are for public school and homeschool students in kindergarten (age 5) - high school. Some grades are near capacity so please do not delay registering. Until Aug 1, tuition for parish members is \$70 for 1 child; \$120 for 2 children and \$150 for 3 children in the same family. After Aug 1, add \$20. The tuition payment by cash or check is expected at the time of registration. Religious Education classes meet on Sundays, 9-10:15am at QofA School. The first day of class is **Sept 8, 2019**. New students need to provide birth and baptismal certificates to register. Parents of unbaptized children under the age of 5 are asked to contact the parish office.

The Better Part

From Pope Benedict XVI's Angelus on Sunday July 18, 2010

In today's Gospel we are reminded of the need to rest from our daily labors, so that we may give time to the one thing that is truly necessary in our lives listening to the word of God in attentive stillness. It is Mary, not Martha, who chose the better part.

We are familiar with the scene: Martha and Mary are two sisters; one sister is bustling about busily and the other, as it were, enraptured by the presence of the Teacher and by his words. A little later Martha, who is evidently resentful, can no longer resist and complains, even feeling that she has a right to criticize Jesus: "Lord, do you not care that my sister has left me to serve alone? Tell her then to help me". Martha would even like to teach the Teacher! Jesus on the other hand answers her very calmly: "Martha, Martha", and the repetition of her name expresses his affection, "you are anxious and troubled about many things; only one thing is needful. Mary has chosen the good portion, which shall not be taken away from her" (10:41-42).

Christ's words are quite clear: there is no contempt for active life, nor even less for generous hospitality; rather, a distinct reminder of the fact that the only really necessary thing is something else: listening to the word of the Lord; and the Lord is there at that moment, present in the Person of Jesus! All the rest will pass away and will be taken from us but the word of God is eternal and gives meaning to our daily actions.

Dear friends, as I said, this Gospel passage is more than ever in tune with the vacation period, because it recalls the fact that the human person must indeed work and be involved in domestic and professional occupations, but first and foremost needs God, who is the inner light of Love and Truth. Without love, even the most important activities lose their value and give no joy. Without a profound meaning, all our activities are reduced to sterile and unorganized activism. And who, if not Jesus Christ, gives us Love and Truth? Therefore, brothers and sisters, let us learn to help each other, to collaborate, but first of all to choose together the better part which is and always will be our greatest good.
