GOSPEL REFLECTION

17th Sunday in Ordinary Time: Spending Wisely

While common financial wisdom urges us to save wisely for the future, to spend within our means, to avoid impulse purchases, and to diversify our assets, the Lord Jesus, in the parables the Church gives us this Sunday, commends the opposite action. He encourages us to imitate the treasure hunter and the pearl merchant who act lavishly, without measure, and immediately. In no world is it a wise action to sell everything one owns for anything. So why then does Jesus counsel us to follow the example of such foolishness? What is the difference when the kingdom of heaven is involved?

The difference is, in large part, one of means and ends. In our daily lives, money is a means to acquire food, clothing, shelter, and entertainment, all of which are themselves means to obtain and preserve earthly happiness. We preserve our wealth so as to achieve our end, our purpose. In fact, if anyone acquires wealth for its own sake, we consider that out of order. We must remember though that we as human beings have a further and greater end and purpose than earthly happiness, namely, union with God, which lasts forever, and which satisfies and overwhelms every other lesser desire.

Christ urges that we be willing to spend all our means for the attainment of this true and perfect end. All the things that make for earthly happiness will pass away, without fail, but this union with God perfects whatever good things we knew on earth, and surpasses them infinitely in eternity. Why would we hold anything back in pursuing the Kingdom of God? Why would we use cold and calculating measures to invest bit by sparing bit in the purpose of our existence? While wise thrift makes sense when dealing with what is earthly, since we know there is always another possible day coming to us, when it comes to the things that are eternal, thrift is only harmful. We will receive the joys of union with God in the measure that we desire and pursue them. We should learn to loosen the moneybag of our soul, and spend lavishly on that one pearl of great price that is divine life.
