PASTOR'S LETTER

Greetings dear brothers and sisters,

We are now in Ordinary Time and during this time, we meditate on the ministry of the public life of Jesus. The Master instructs us and shows us the beauty and simplicity of the Kingdom of God. Today, this Sunday precisely, presents us with two images of great spiritual intensity: the parable of the growth of the seed and the parable of the mustard seed, with these He seeks to extend the kingdom of God among us, and if we meditate carefully we will discover that these parables continue to resonate in our modern minds because behind the sowing of the seed, watering and reaping, we intuit what Jesus is telling us: God has planted something divine in our hearts; God wants to live and grow within us. Let us seek God's wisdom and obey His inner indications; if we do, then our life will acquire strength and an intensity difficult to imagine, and we will be able to grow in wisdom, grace, and holiness.

This summer, I want to inform you that we will have the joy and privilege of having a seminarian from our diocese in our parish. His name is Alfredo Tuesta. Alfredo has finished his second year of Pre-Theology at Saint Charles Borromeo Seminary in Pennsylvania. He will begin his stay in our parish Monday, June 7. I hope we welcome him and make him feel like family. I thank Bishop and the Office of Vocations for their trust in our parish. Alfredo will dedicate his time to give some formation sessions to our liturgical ministries during his stay with us, and I invite you to participate. In the coming days, we will provide you with more information about these formation sessions.

Friday, June 11, is the feast of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Saint John Paul II said that "this feast recalls the mystery of the Love that God harbors for men of all times," therefore, it is a special day to meditate on how much love God has for each one of us. Also, on this day, the World Day of Prayer for the Sanctification of Priest is celebrated. Through our priests, God guides us and accompanies us and especially feeds us with the Eucharist and comforts and heals us with the sacraments given to us through them. I ask you to offer a prayer for the sanctification of the priests of our diocese and those of the whole world. Let us ask Jesus to give us healthy, wise, and holy Priests to continue showing His love to the world.


Finally, I thank all of you who supported the parish during the time of the pandemic through your weekly donations; without your help, the parish would not have been able to move forward. Thanks to your generous heart, many changes and reparations have been made in our sanctuary and other parish building areas. I also thank all those who continue to send their donations for the Capital Campaign. God bless you; there is still a lot to do! I hope next year to finish the projects with which this initiative began. I also invite those who have not yet made a promise to do so. We needed to complete these work projects.

I wish you all a blessed week, and I ask the heart of Jesus to show his love and mercy to all.

Religious Education Information

We wish our Religious Education families a restful and blessed summer. Classes will resume on **September 12, 2021**.

Pictures from the May 22 First Holy Communion Masses are ready for viewing in the parish office. Also, certificates are available for pickup. Please come by the parish office during the week, Mon-Fri, 9:30am - 12 Noon, 12:30-4:30pm to view/order photos and to obtain your child's First Holy Communion certificate.

Registration for the 2021-2022 Religious Education school year is open! Current Religious Education families are asked to register for the next school year by **August 1**. Stop by the parish office (4329 Sano St), M-F, 9:30am-5pm. or complete the registration form: <https://queenofapostles.org/religious-education/>. The Religious Education Program at Queen of Apostles is available to parish youth in grades kindergarten (age 5) - high school. In-person classes will be held on Sunday mornings, 10:30-11:45am beginning on **September 12, 2021**. Queen of Apostles parishioners and returning students are given priority for Religious Education enrollment. Class size is limited as we balance safety protocols with student learning and faith formation. *Non-parishioners will be placed on a wait list until Aug 1, 2021.* The registration form and tuition are to be submitted together. Birth and baptismal certificates for new students are to be provided at the time of registration. Because each year builds on the next year of faith formation, students must attend at least two consecutive years of Religious Education before a grade/age-appropriate Sacrament is administered, have no more than three absences during the school year, and score at least 70% on tests. Generally, baptized children receive First Penance/ First Holy Communion in grade 2 and higher and Confirmation is received in grade 8 and higher. A student is to show evidence of desire and preparation for a Sacrament. Families with unbaptized children under the age of 7 years old are to contact the parish office, 703-354-8711 or general@queenofapostles.org. Thank you for considering our program. In concert with parents, Religious Education is an opportunity for your child to live the Catholic faith by learning to pray, knowing the Bible, learning Scripture, and preparing for and living the Sacraments.

RCIA

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) is the process through which adults join or complete his/her initiation into the Roman Catholic Church. If interested in attending RCIA for the next school year, **Sept 2021-June 2022**, please contact Susan Gray or talk with a priest.

Altar Servers

The June altar server schedule has been sent. If your son (grade 4 and above) is willing to serve at Holy Mass, please contact Susan Gray or Fr. Rampino. Generally, boys serve every other weekend. Boys who are serving Mass are asked to arrive no less than 15 min before Mass, wear dress shoes, use the upper sacristy, wear a facemask if preferred, and wait for the priest. Thank you for your service.

Catechist, Aides, and Volunteers for RE

For the 2021-2022 RE school year, we seek practicing Catholics who love the Catholic faith and want to help develop the faith in our youth. As sowers of the Gospel, catechists, aides, substitutes, and volunteers are needed on Sunday mornings for in-person classes. Class time is 75 mins and planning time is about 1-2 hours/week. All are welcome to apply to serve this ministry. We provide you with materials, support, and opportunities to attend Diocesan and parish workshops and obtain certification. Attendance at a Virtus seminar and completion of Virginia Background Check paperwork are required. On **Aug 28**, Fr. Rampino will lead a workshop for catechists that will review the Pope's recent "motu proprio" and the establishment of the lay ministry of catechist. If interested, please contact Susan Gray.

Gospel Commentary for 11th Sunday in Ordinary Time: Growing at the Lord's Pace

If we were to come up with a list of the defining marks of American culture, I am fairly well convinced that a demand for and expectation of efficiency might make the top five. We often, even unconsciously, value ourselves and others according to productivity and ability to complete our to-do lists, our ability to accomplish and achieve in the outside world, or to order and care for in our home lives. We believe that effort should correspond directly to results. We expect things to happen according to our schedules, for the fulfillment all our desires to be available to us at whatever moment we chose, and when our drive for efficiency is blocked, by our own humanity, by others in our homes, by people at work, or by the outside world, how quickly frustration sets in! Has that not been one of the major difficulties of the pandemic, once any initial enjoyment of a slower life had faded away?

Yet, when Christ tells us parables about the Kingdom of Heaven, about the life of grace, our life with the Lord in His Church, He uses a set of images that run counter to our desire for clear and timely results. He says to us that the Kingdom of Heaven is like seed that grows of its own accord. The farmer may tend the fields, but he cannot make the seed grow or ripen. The seed grows as God wills, according to the almost imperceptible pace of the natural world. Only at the very end is the long-awaited result clear. He tells us that the Kingdom of Heaven begins as small as the mustard seed, easily missed or overlooked, and only after years of silent growth, again accomplished by God and not any other person, does it become large and strong enough to bear the weight of the birds.

What does this all mean for us? It means that we must accept that growth in our spiritual lives, in the life of the parish or the Church, will grow at God's pace, and that we may not be able to hurry it along by simply working harder. Sometimes the Lord will permit quick growth, easily seen, like the grain finally appearing in the ear. Most of the time, He works in silence, purifying, humbling, and strengthening us, like stalks of young wheat that have to endure the wind and rain while the roots dig deep enough to support the full weight of the mature plant. Our job is not to force spiritual growth anywhere, in ourselves or in others. It is to tend the ground of our soul so that God Himself can give the growth when He pleases.

This regular maintenance of our souls, undertaken through Sunday and daily Mass, our daily prayers, scripture reading, the Rosary, regular confession, spiritual reading, and discipline, is not usually exciting. A calm and regular parish life does not carry all of the promise of immediate catharsis or progress that a big retreat weekend or flashy pastoral activities might, as good as those things certainly can be in moderation. But it is the regular quiet work that we do, simply tending to the souls we have been given day in and day out, that makes the greatest fruits possible. We of course must ask for the grace to persevere through dry periods, through trials and crises, through the quietest moments, when we might wonder what it's all worth, but if we reach out for that help, the Lord who is faithful we give us what we need to continue. Then we will indeed see the beautiful harvest He has prepared in us for the sake of all, and we will rejoice in having remained with Him as it grew in quiet.
