Religious Education Registration for the **2018-19** Queen of Apostles Religious Education school year is open to students in kindergarten (age 5) through high school. Registration forms are available at the parish office. New students need to provide birth and baptismal certificates. Tuition may be paid by check or cash. Pastor's Letter

Why did Paul VI give out Humanae Vitae?

This year during the Lenten Soup Supper program, we held some presentations on Humanae Vitae. After one of them, I remember senior parishioners sharing how they, just married, were waiting on the Church to make a decision on contraception. Left behind the post war hardships, the whole world was living in a time of optimism and progress. Queen of Apostles parish was recently established (May 14, 1963). On the "dark side", the contraceptive pill was successful and its use generalized. But, what would the Church say about it?

There was no clarity at all. Some predicted that the Church, in her effort to adapt to the current times, will no doubt accept it. Many theologians, moralists and even bishops were in favor. A minority said that the Popes had already taken a position about contraception. Therefore, even if the pill was a totally new contraceptive "technology", it would be rejected all the same.

The topic, discussed during the Second Vatican Council, was referred to Pope Paul VI for a final decision. However even "this holy synod does not intend to propose immediately concrete solutions", it said: "when there is question of harmonizing conjugal love with the responsible transmission of life, the moral aspects of any procedure does not depend solely on sincere intentions or on an evaluation of motives, but must be determined by objective standards. These, based on the nature of the human person and his acts, preserve the full sense of mutual self-giving and human procreation in the context of true love. Such a goal cannot be achieved unless the virtue of conjugal chastity is sincerely practiced. Relying on these principles, sons of the Church may not undertake methods of birth control which are found blameworthy by the teaching authority of the Church in its unfolding of the divine law" (Gaudium et Spes 51; see also note 14).

Having settled these principles, a Commission started the work to propose to the Pope a response to the pill question. It may surprise us that, in the commission, theology scholars were in favor while other experts like medical doctor, nurses, lawyers or philosophers were opposed. The difficulty was evident and Pope Paul VI received a text which had four different drafts. Moreover, he was aware that a negative response would cause turmoil in the Catholic Church and for married couples.

There came to be a tipping point. Paul VI decided to take some days to pray on the issue and make the final decision. He asked for a last bit of advice from a Polish bishop: Karol Wojtyła (future Pope St. John Paul II). And we know that he did "on the 25th day of July, the feast of St. James the Apostle, in the year 1968" (HV 31).

How much Paul VI and the whole Church had to suffer for this decision is another story. But, good heavens! He was right, and regrettably, our humanity suffers the consequences of not receiving those words of life, the truth of human life (in Latin Humanae Vitae).

Rule of Life: Devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus

his Month we propose the Devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, which is at the very center of the charism of the Disciples of the Hearts of Jesus and Mary. Jesus' Heart reveals to us God the Father's love for us. The human heart of the Incarnate Son also discloses the deep intimacy Jesus had with the Father, teaching us how to love and give ourselves to God the Father. The Catechism of the Catholic Church n. 478 teaches:

"THE HEART OF THE INCARNATE WORD. Jesus knew and loved us each and all during his life, his agony and his Passion, and gave himself up for each one of us: 'The Son of God... loved me and gave himself for me' (Gal 2:20)."He has loved us all with a human heart. For this reason, the Sacred Heart of Jesus, pierced by our sins and for our salvation, is quite rightly considered the chief sign and symbol of that love with which the divine Redeemer continually loves the eternal Father and all human beings without exception."

We invite you to pray every day the prayer for the Mass of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, as a consecration of our parish to the Sacred Heart of Jesus:

Grant, we pray, almighty God, that we, who glory in the Heart of your beloved Son and recall the wonders of his love for us, may be made worthy to receive an overflowing measure of grace from that fount of heavenly gifts. Through Christ our Lord.
