Religious Education Registration for the **2017-2018** school year is open. QofA's Religious Education program welcomes students from Kindergarten (age 5) through high school. Returning students must register each year. Forms are available during Religious Education, from the parish office, and online: http://queenofapostles.org/wp-content/uploads/RegistrationForm_2017-2018_1andGhanaandHSBible.pdf.

New students need to bring birth and baptismal certificates. The first day of RE is **Sep. 10**.

Registration fees: \$70 for 1 child; \$120 for 2 children; \$150 for 3+ children in the same family. Queen of Apostles parishioners and returning students are given priority for enrollment. We accept cash and check payable to Queen of Apostles. Registration fees do not include fees associated with sacraments.

Students are assigned to the Religious Education grade that parallels his/her public school grade. Students must attend two consecutive years of Religious Education before a sacrament is administered (generally, First Penance/First Holy Communion are received in grade 2 and higher; Confirmation is received in grade 8 and higher). Families with unbaptized children under the age of 7 years old are asked to call the parish office at (703) 354-8711.

Pastor's Letter

Strategic Planning

If any organization, including the parish, is to succeed, one of the resources to be employed is Strategic planning. As a Catholic parish we want to succeed because we have the highest and worthiest of the goals: to be holy and to help others to go to heaven. Thus we want to set the best professional practices at the service of this goal.

This Sunday we celebrate Corpus Christi and we confess that the Eucharist is "the source and summit of the Christian life" (II Vatican, Lumen Gentium 11.) Thus, my Eucharistic life will mark the tone of my faith and my holiness. And this is when strategic planning enters. Strategic planning involves: 1) analysis or assessment; 2) strategy formulation; 3) strategy execution, and 4) evaluation.

First, making an assessment: how is my Eucharistic life?

Second, formulating a strategy: Let me propose some fundamental tips. Come to Mass a little earlier and adore Christ in the tabernacle asking him for a worthy and fruitful communion. Pay attention to the consecration, that unique miracle that we witness at every Mass. Before receiving communion ask Mary to be in your heart to welcome Jesus and show respect in the way you walk down, receive Jesus and go back to the pew. That respect in your physical demeanor will help your internal disposition. In the pew focus on acknowledging Jesus in your heart and adoring him; give him thanks, and pray for the many intentions no doubt you have. If you don't know what to say, ask Mary to take care of your divine guest and ask the Holy Spirit to come to your help. Finally after Mass, stay a little longer to continue giving thanks. That's for the Mass.


(What also about adoration? We are so blessed to have and adoration Chapel. There is a family –even with the toddler–that stops by the Adoration Chapel five minutes before going to the school. They are a good example of how to grow with simple practices possible even for children. Or visit Jesus in the tabernacle.)

Last tip: the spiritual communion. A simple one is "I wish, Lord, to receive you with the purity, humility and devotion with which your most holy Mother received you, with the spirit and fervor of the saints."

Third, strategy execution: What will be your first step to follow the plan you have made in Eucharistic holiness?

Four, evaluate: If I didn't follow my whole plan last Sunday, what can I do in preparation for this Sunday? Perhaps some reminder; perhaps even simplifying your plan. Don't let discouragement take you away from your noble intentions.

This Sunday, after the noon Mass we will accompany Jesus in adoration in the Corpus Christi procession through our neighborhood. It will be a testimony of how much we esteem Jesus in the Eucharist and to invite others to adore him: Oh come let us adore him!



Rule of Life Devotion for the Month of June Ministry

Becoming a Disciple of Jesus Christ leads naturally to the practice of SERVICE after the One who came not to be served but to serve (Mk 10:45). There is no love of God without love of neighbor which is spoken in the concrete and real words of service and ministry.

- * Step 1: Examine your personality and strengths and find the fitting ministry.
- * Step 2: Meet the Head of Ministry and find an opportunity to attend a ministry event.
- * Step 3: Commit as a volunteer/participant in the ministry.
