PASTOR'S LETTER

Dear brothers and sisters,

This Sunday, we will listen to one of the most emblematic evangelical passages in these current turbulent times, and like the disciples, in the gospel, we are terrified to know that we can perish, that our boat is going to sink, we are so focused on the strong wind of the problems that we come to doubt, and our faith falters. And that's when we begin to claim God and ask Him, where are you? Why are you silent? Why do you ignore me? We have asked ourselves all these questions more than once, but the problem is not that God does not exist or that He is not present, but that we live as if God did not exist. Here is God's answer: "Why are you terrified? Do you not yet have faith?" (Mk 4, 40). That is what Jesus said to the apostles, and he said the same to Saint Faustina Kowalska: "My daughter, do not be afraid of anything, I am always with you, even if it seems to you that I am not." Today, Jesus invites us to have faith in Him, even in the hardest and most difficult moments of our life, to pray and repeat with faith: "Jesus, I trust in You."

Exactly one year ago, Father Rampino and I arrived at the parish. As your pastor, I am very grateful for the support received; I confess that in my fifteen years of priestly ministry, this has been the most significant challenge I have received since I was given the task of taking the leadership of the parish in the midst of a challenging situation for everyone, but thank God together we have made progress, and we have made history. I still have not met all of you, I think I barely know a small percentage of all parishioners, but I have the faith that I will get to know all of you little by little. Since I arrived, I have tried to do my best and give my best. I have tried to respond to your requests and guide you as much as I could. As a human, I made mistakes, and perhaps I have not fulfilled the expectations that many had, but I know that it has not been for lack of will. A parish pastor is made with the help and support of his sheep because I cannot know everything in its entirety. Thanks to all who have been willing to continue working, I wish with all my heart to continue developing our parish, to continue building the kingdom of God, and above all, evangelizing. There is still much to do; help me, do not leave me alone in this task because we are a community of faith that grows in communion. In my daily prayers, I ask for the wisdom not to fail you, but I often have to make uncomfortable decisions, and that is where I ask for your understanding because sometimes it's not just up to me. In this first year, I thank God for being your pastor, for His blessings and affection towards me.

Also, I want to inform you that Susan Gray, the parish DRE has decided to resign from this position and take a new job in another parish. I am very grateful for her support this year. I wish her the best in her new job and that God bless her future; at the same time, I invite you to pray for her. Thank you, Susan, for your years of service to this ministry and this parish. I hope to have a new DRE soon and continue with the catechizing work; I ask you to help me pray for this intention.

Finally, I let you know that the gate behind the school will remain permanently closed for security reasons; there have been several problems with non-parishioners who use it mainly during the day and at night. The vast majority use it to shorten the path. They put the safety of the parishioners at risk since many do not understand that it is private property and, above all, it is a Catholic church. I ask for your understanding.

I have you in my prayers.

Religious Education Information

We wish our Religious Education families a restful and blessed summer. Classes will resume on **September 12, 2021**.

Pictures from the May 22 First Holy Communion Masses are ready for viewing in the parish office. Also, certificates are available for pickup. Please come by the parish office during the week, Mon-Fri, 9:30am - 12 Noon, 12:30-4:30pm to view/order photos and to obtain your child's First Holy Communion certificate.

Registration for the 2021-2022 Religious Education school year is open! Current Religious Education families are asked to register for the next school year by **August 1**. Stop by the parish office (4329 Sano St), M-F, 9:30am-5pm. or complete the registration form: <https://queenofapostles.org/religious-education/>. The Religious Education Program at Queen of Apostles is available to parish youth in grades kindergarten (age 5) - high school. In-person classes will be held on Sunday mornings, 10:30-11:45am beginning on **September 12, 2021**. Queen of Apostles parishioners and returning students are given priority for Religious Education enrollment. Class size is limited as we balance safety protocols with student learning and faith formation. *Non-parishioners will be placed on a wait list until Aug 1, 2021.* The registration form and tuition are to be submitted together. Birth and baptismal certificates for new students are to be provided at the time of registration. Because each year builds on the next year of faith formation, students must attend at least two consecutive years of Religious Education before a grade/age-appropriate Sacrament is administered, have no more than three absences during the school year, and score at least 70% on tests. Generally, baptized children receive First Penance/ First Holy Communion in grade 2 and higher and Confirmation is received in grade 8 and higher. A student is to show evidence of desire and preparation for a Sacrament. Families with unbaptized children under the age of 7 years old are to contact the parish office, 703-354-8711 or general@queenofapostles.org. Thank you for considering our program. In concert with parents, Religious Education is an opportunity for your child to live the Catholic faith by learning to pray, knowing the Bible, learning Scripture, and preparing for and living the Sacraments.

He will host another training/refresher class. Boys who are serving Mass are asked to arrive no less than 15 min before Mass, wear dress pants and dress shoes, use the upper sacristy, and wait for the priest. Thank you.

Catechist, Aides, and Volunteers for RE

For the 2021-2022 RE school year, we seek practicing Catholics who love the Catholic faith and want to help develop the faith in our youth. As sowers of the Gospel, catechists, aides, substitutes, and volunteers are needed on Sunday mornings for in-person classes. Class time is 75 mins and planning time is about 1-2 hours/week. All are welcome to apply to serve this ministry. We provide you with materials, support, and opportunities to attend Diocesan and parish workshops and obtain certification. Attendance at a Virtus seminar and completion of Virginia Background Check paperwork are required. On **Aug 28**, Fr. Rampino will lead a workshop for catechists that will review the Pope's recent "motu proprio" and the establishment of the lay ministry of catechist.

Gospel Commentary for 12th Sunday in Ordinary Time: The Sleeping Savior

“Peace. Be still.” With these words, Christ in this week’s Gospel calms the storm that threatens His disciples, and calls them to deeper faith in Him. This striking scene of the storm on the Sea of Galilee prompts us too to confront our own faith. Who is it that we believe Christ to be? What do we believe He can do or wants to do with the storms in our lives? Who should we see in Jesus Christ when we see Him arise and act?

In the Gospel episode, the disciples show yet again that they do not clearly understand the identity of Jesus of Nazareth. When the storm arises, and their teacher sleeps in one of the boats, they are moved to wake Him. They apparently believe that He must be awake and active in order to save them from harm, implying that He will have to exert Himself to some degree in order to calm the storm. They still see Him as a miracle working Rabbi, even if a unique one, someone with supernatural abilities not unlike magic, and so therefore on the same scale as the maladies and dangers He confronts. Because of this, they believe that His silence and sleep means death and destruction for them. Unless He arises, the storm will consume them all.

We may find ourselves in a similar place with the Lord. How do we react when storms arise in our lives? How do we approach the Lord? How do we react to His silence? Perhaps sometimes, when trials or crises confront us, we feel as though we have to wake the Lord, employing different types of prayers and devotions, making deals with heaven, in an effort to draw the attention of God to our difficulties. We can imagine that maybe God is not powerful enough to heal or calm the storms in our souls, families, nation, Church or world, or if He is, He is only just mighty enough. When it seems like He is sleeping in our boat, we can interpret it as an indication that He does not care, or that perhaps He cannot help us. We, like the disciples, may cry out to Him in fear, hoping to provoke an unlikely act of salvation.

The truth is that all the world belongs entirely to Christ Jesus, and nothing in this world, natural or spiritual, even remotely approaches His power and glory. He does not sleep out of indifference or out of powerlessness, but because He does not need to wake in order to bring everything to its proper end. He acts even when silent, and His action in hidden quiet is mightier than all our waking efforts could ever be. He awakes and rebukes the storm for the sake of His disciples, so that they might believe and no longer fear, but not because He needs to do so to make all things calm. Had one of the disciples simply said, “we need not fear, for the Master is with us,” the storm would still have come to nothing.

In our lives too, when the Lord appears to sleep, it is never because He has abandoned, forgotten, or rejected us. Even in silence He acts with inexorable authority and power. In those moments, He calls us to trust that He is with us, and that He can and will work good from all things, no matter how hopeless they might seem in the moment. He asks us whether or not we really believe that He is the King of Kings and Lord of Lords. As we ask ourselves that question this week, let’s also ask Christ for that grace of seeing Him with the eyes of real faith, as He truly is, and the God who has loved us, and cares for us in all things.

CARTA DEL PÁRROCO

Queridos hermanos y hermanas:

Este domingo escucharemos uno de los pasajes evangélicos mas emblemáticos en estos tiempos turbulentos que vivimos, y al igual que los discípulos en el evangelio nos aterroriza saber que podemos perecer, que nuestra barca se va a hundir, estamos tan enfocados en el viento fuerte de los problemas que llegamos a dudar, y nuestra fe tambalea. Y es entonces cuando le comenzamos a reclamar a Dios, y a preguntarle ¿Dónde estás? ¿Por qué callas? ¿Por qué me ignoras? todas esas preguntas nos las hemos hecho más de una vez, pero el problema no es que Dios no exista o que no esté, sino que los hombres vivamos como si Dios no existiera. Aún hay mucho por hacer, ayúdenme, no me dejen solo en esta tarea porque somos una comunidad de fe que crece en comunión, y en mis oraciones diarias pido la sabiduría para no fallarles, pero muchas veces tengo que tomar decisiones que incomodan y es ahí donde les pido su comprensión, porque a veces no solo depende de mí. En este primer año doy gracias a Dios por ser su párroco y por su comprensión y sus muestras de cariño.

También, quiero comunicarles que Susan Gray la DRE de la parroquia ha tomado a bien renunciar a este cargo y tomar un nuevo trabajo en otra parroquia, estoy muy agradecido por su apoyo en este año, le deseo lo mejor en su nuevo trabajo y que Dios bendiga su futuro al mismo tiempo les invito a orar por ella. Gracias Susan por tus años de servicio a este ministerio y a esta parroquia. Espero poder tener un nuevo DRE pronto y continuar con el trabajo catequizador, les pido me ayuden a orar por esta intensión.
