

PASTOR'S LETTER

Dear brothers and sisters,

We are celebrating the Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time. Today, Saint Mark presents us with the despair of the sick looking for comfort and health. Even that day, a man named Jairus, the head of the synagogue, made his way through the crowd to implore for his daughter's health.

Who knows if that man knew Jesus, but finding himself so desperate, he decided to invoke his help. Jesus sees the faith of that afflicted father and performs that unexpected miracle, which undoubtedly changed the life of the father and the daughter forever; the only thing that Jesus asked of that father was a greater faith, capable of going beyond doubts and fear.

We too should have more faith, that faith that does not doubt in the face of life's difficulties and trials, and that knows how to mature in pain through our union with Christ, as Pope Benedict XVI suggests in his encyclical Spe Salvi (Saved in Hope): "What heals man is not by sidestepping or fleeing from suffering that we are healed, but rather by our capacity for accepting it, maturing through it and finding meaning through union with Christ, who suffered with infinite love." (Spe Salvi # 37).

As previously advised, this weekend the dispensation to attend Mass on Sunday's ends due to pandemic restrictions changes. The region's bishops have decided that it is time for us to participate in person in the Sunday Eucharist, although the dispensation will continue to be valid only for those who are sick or have a delicate medical condition will continue with this dispensation. For everyone else, the dispensation will no longer be valid; this means that if you do not attend Mass, you incur a serious sin, as stated in the Catechism of the Catholic Church number 2181. Therefore, starting next Sunday, July 4th, it will only be transmitted via Facebook the 10:00 am Mass in English, the 1:30 pm mass in Spanish, and the 6:30 am daily Mass. The other Masses will no longer be transmitted.

I also inform you that on July 2nd, we will reopen the Adoration Chapel. We will only do it for two days: Friday and Saturday. I know that the past was all different, but it is tough for me to guess how to do things, as I expressed in the previous letter. Thank God we have most of the hours covered; some spaces are still available, but I have faith that we will soon fill all of them. I ask you to register; there are sign-up sheets in the vestibule, and you choose the time you would like to participate. It is an hour with the Lord, and it is a worship service to Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament. He always calls us to follow Him, and if there is devotion and love, there must be humility and docility to serve Him.

Finally, I inform you more than a month in advance that on August 21st, we will celebrate our Patroness Feast in honor of Our Lady, Queen of the Apostles, and in honor of this feast, we will have a family festival in the parking lot of our parish. The idea is to have games for the children, entertainment for everyone, live music, performances and food from different cultures. We will also have a raffle that we will inform you soon what it will be. Mark it on your calendar, and at the same time, I ask you to help me in the organization or as a volunteer on the day of the event. The festival has a double objective, to have fun and unite us more, and have an economic profit for the parish.

I look forward to your support and your presence that day.

May you all have a happy week, and may Jesus and Mary always bless you.

Religious Education Information

We wish our Religious Education families a restful and blessed summer. Classes will resume on **September 12**, **2021**.

We thank Susan Gray, our (former) DRE, for her many years of dedicated service to Queen of Apostles Church and School and we wish her the best in her new endeavors.

Register today for the 2021-2022 Religious Education school year! Current Religious Education families are asked to register for the next school year by Aug 1. Stop by the parish office (4329 Sano St), M-F, 9:30am-5pm. or complete the registration form: https://queenofapostles.org/religiouseducation/. The Religious Education Program at Queen of Apostles is available to parish youth in grades kindergarten (age 5) - high school. In-person classes will be held on Sunday mornings, 10:30-11:45am beginning on Sept 12, 2021. Queen of Apostles parishioners and returning students are given priority for Religious Education enrollment. Class size is limited as we balance safety protocols with student learning and faith formation. Non-parishioners will be placed on a wait list until Aug 1, 2021. The registration form and tuition are to be submitted together. Birth and baptismal certificates for new students are to be provided at the time of registration. Because each year builds on the next year of faith formation, students must attend at least two consecutive years of Religious Education before a grade/age-appropriate Sacrament is administered, have no more than three absences during the school year, and score at least 70% on tests. Generally, baptized children receive First Penance/ First Holy Communion in grade 2 and higher and Confirmation is received in grade 8 and higher. A student is to show evidence of desire and preparation for a Sacrament. Families with unbaptized children under the age of 7 years old are to contact the parish office, 703-354-8711 or general@queenofapostles.org. In concert with parents, Religious Education is an opportunity for your child to live the Catholic faith by learning to pray, knowing the Bible, learning Scripture, and preparing for and living the Sacraments.

If your child received a sacrament in 2020-2021, please stop by the parish office to pick up the certificate.

Catechist, Aides, and Volunteers for RE

For the 2021-2022 RE school year, we seek practicing Catholics who love the Catholic faith and want to help develop the faith in our youth. As sowers of the Gospel, catechists ,aides, substitutes, and volunteers are needed on Sunday mornings for in-person classes. Class time is 75 mins and planning time is about 1-2 hours/week. All are welcome to apply to serve this ministry. We provide you with materials, support, and opportunities to attend Diocesan and parish workshops and obtain certification. Attendance at a Virtus seminar and completion of Virginia Background Check paperwork are required. On **Aug 28**, Fr. Rampino will lead a workshop for catechists that will review the Pope's recent "motu proprio" and the establishment of the lay ministry of catechist.

Gospel Commentary for 13th Sunday in Ordinary Time: True Faith

"Do not be afraid, just have faith." This Sunday's Gospel centers on this command and encouragement of Jesus Christ. We find in this passage two women in need of miraculous help. The first, a woman who had suffered with a twelve year flow of blood, and the second, a young girl of twelve years, dead before her time. In the first case, the woman's ailment places her in ritual impurity according to the old Jewish law, not only for a few days each month, but year after year, exiled from the life of God's people. In the second case, the young girl is placed not only outside of the ritual life of God's people, but all life, consigned to Sheol, the land of the dead. Both situations seem beyond help, and in both, Christ calls for faith, but what a difference in the belief He encounters!

The family of the young girl seeks help with imperfect faith. Jairus, the girl's father, believes that Christ can bring health back to his daughter, but still thinks that physical presence is required, as though the healing were magic. In fact, when he finds that his daughter has actually died, Christ must call him back, urging him to keep faith in the possibility of a healing. Further, the entire house, upon Jesus' assurance that He will wake the child, who is only sleeping to Him, laughs scornfully, with what we can only imagine is great bitterness. This bitterness tells us that they are still tied up in worldly ways of thinking, perhaps wrestling with disappointed plans for the future, expectations which this daughter, sister, and friend of theirs will no longer fulfill. They have not yet learned faith, but had set their hopes on the world and its joys. Yet Christ, out of compassion for their pain, still works the miracle, restores life, and brings the whole house into a new world. The presence of God has broken into their lives in an undeniable way, and now they will have to decide whether they wish to re-found everything on friendship with God or not.

How different is the woman who seek to cure her flow of blood! She has already suffered something close to death for an ancient Jewish person during all those twelve years of the young girl's life. She has learned courage through her suffering, as well as discernment and humility. Her physical pain, the poverty to which her many treatments have reduced her, and the isolation that her particular ailment causes have taught her not to hope in anything the world offers. Her heart has, in a way, been purified of reliance on any present or future prosperity. All of this has freed her soul for faith, and when she reaches out with trust in Christ's power, she is immediately healed. Christ calls her out of her humble hiddenness into His presence, and we can well imagine, smiles at her as a friend. It is on account of this woman's deep but humble and faith, learned through the purification of suffering, reliant only on God, that the Church has always identified herself in her.

We too ought to ask ourselves: which am I? In whom do I believe? Do I set my hopes on what the world can provide, in what I can get for myself with my own abilities? Or do I truly hope in Christ, knowing that only He can provide the relief and joy that I seek? May the Lord strengthen our hearts to choose wisely, and so receive the great gifts He has set apart for us!

CARTA DEL PÁRROCO

Queridos hermanos y hermanas,

Estamos celebrando el décimo tercer domingo del tiempo ordinario. Hoy, san Marcos nos presenta la desesperación de los enfermos buscando consuelo y salud. Incluso, aquel día se abrió paso entre la multitud un hombre llamado Jairo, el jefe de la sinagoga, para implorar la salud de su hija. Quién sabe si aquel hombre conocía de vista a Jesús, pero al encontrarse tan desesperado, decidió invocar su ayuda. Jesús viendo la fe de aquel padre afligido realiza aquel inesperado milagro, que cambió por seguro la vida del padre y la hija para siempre; lo único que Jesús le pidió a aquel padre fue una fe más grande, capaz de ir más allá de las dudas y del miedo.




