Religious Education Do not delay in registering your children for Religious Education - some classes are nearing capacity! Religious Education classes are for public school and home-school students in kindergarten (age 5) - high school. Parents of current students can pick up the registration form on-site during RE class time. Tuition for parish members is \$70 for 1 child; \$120 for 2 children and \$150 for 3 children in the same family. The tuition payment by cash or check is expected at the time of registration.

Religious Education classes meet on Sundays, 9-10:15 am at QofA School. The first day of class is **Sep. 8**. Because each year builds on the next year of faith formation, students must attend at least 2 consecutive years of Religious Education before a Sacrament is administered and have no more than three absences during the school year. Generally, baptized children receive First Penance/First Holy Communion in grade 2 and higher and Confirmation is received in grade 8 and higher. A student is to show evidence of desire and preparation for a Sacrament. New students need to provide birth and baptismal certificates to register. Parents of unbaptized children under the age of 5 are asked to contact the parish office.

Called to be a Catechist, Aide, Volunteer? For the **2019-2020** Religious Education school year, we are seeking practicing Catholics who have a love of the Catholic faith and want to help develop the faith in our youth. Catechists are to have a basic understanding of Catholic teaching, Scripture, and Tradition and a commitment to the Church's liturgical and sacramental life, and moral teachings. Catechists (teachers), aides (assist the catechists), and volunteers (assist with registration, setup, etc) are needed on Sunday mornings for the **Sep. 8, 2019 - Jun. 7, 2020** program. Prayerfully consider if you are called to respond to Jesus and serve as a disciple by helping teach the faith. We provide you with materials, support, and opportunities to attend Diocesan workshops. Pastor's Letter

QofA is a Family

This Sunday we celebrate the Solemnity of Pentecost. The Holy Spirit descends on Mary and the Apostles, giving them the strength to go forth and announce the Good News of the Resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ.

The outpouring of the Holy Spirit is the ultimate fruit of Jesus' Paschal Mystery and Ascension into heaven. Jesus introduces the humanity he received from Mary into the sphere of the divine. He is God, the Son of God, and now his human body and blood, flesh and soul, are fully immersed in the glory of God. Christ has introduced our human flesh into God's intimacy, the communion of love of the Father and the Son in the Holy Spirit, the Most Holy Trinity.

The outpouring of the Holy Spirit means that not only the human has entered into the divine realm. Now, after the pattern of the mystery of the Incarnation, the Holy Spirit comes to dwell in us. The divine enters in the realm of the human: "Whoever loves me will keep my word, and my Father will love him, and we will come to him and make our dwelling with him" (Jn 14:23).

This exchange happens from heart to heart, from Jesus to us. These are the sacraments: Jesus' hands touching us to give us the Holy Spirit who introduce us in the life of the Divine Family: Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

And having the same Father and sharing the same life of grace we become a family. Thus, the Church is a family, QofA is a family. The Disciples of the Hearts of Jesus and Mary are a family. The beautiful thing is that in our parish this is for real. It is not an abstract concept but a reality we all enjoy.

Pentecost is that the Holy Spirit introduces us in a greater communion: the Church. Catholicism is never an individual and pure spiritual relationship with God. It is to enter the space of Jesus' relationships: with the Father, with Mary, with our fellow human beings...

In this familial communion we support each other. And this is the frame for the Disciples' Annual Appeal: we materialize the support the parish family offers in special prayers and also financial assistance. That way the family of the Disciples is strengthened to serve the parish family.

Another dimension of the Disciples being priests for the family is our presence within the parish family. When the Disciples arrived in 2013 the parish has gone through some changes in priests, and now this year in pastor. But now is different than before. The Disciples continue being here, invested in the parish life. Whichever Disciples are here, it remains the Disciples' family with the QofA family.

May the Holy Spirit continue pouring his gifts and blessings on this family of families, QofA and the Disciples.

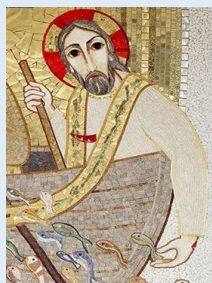


YA Pro-Life Rosary Rally

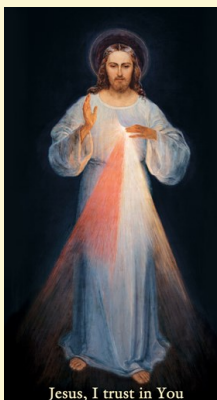
Parish Pilgrimage to the Saint John Paul II National Shrine
