Saint Joseph

Everybody loves St. Patrick's feast day. Green clothing, corned beef, leprechauns... and I like it. It is part of our American culture and honors the Irish legacy of our Country.

Today, Catholics celebrate St. Joseph with a title of "solemnity". It is not a holy day of obligation but is part of our Catholic culture and honors the value of the Catholic faith in our lives.

St. Joseph's passing through the Gospel is discrete and almost unnoticed. However he has a central role in the life and mystery of our Lord Jesus Christ connecting him to King David's dynasty and being Jesus' stepfather.

In our Towards a Family Fully Alive program we highlight this month the role of the father. St. Joseph is the patron saint of fathers and their great model. Let's pick some teachings from his life to inspire us.


St Joseph's fatherhood always respected and honored that Jesus is the Son of God. Caring for Jesus as a loving father, guiding him by example, praying with him, St. Joseph introduced Jesus into his relationship with God the Father. St.

Rule of Life for the Month of March Stations of the Cross

(MARCH) The Stations of the Cross is a traditional Lenten devotion offering witness to Jesus' Passion and Death. At each station we use our senses and imagination to accompany Jesus along the Way of the Cross and use the images to reflect upon His redemptive love for us.

- Step 1: Pray the Stations on Fridays.
- Step 2: Attend the Parish Stations of the Cross (Fridays 7 pm during Lent).
- ❖Step 3: Spend time daily reflecting on the Stations during Lent.
