Religious Education The Religious Education registration for public school and homeschool students in kindergarten (age 5) - high school is now open! Parents of current students can pick up the registration form on-site during RE class time. Tuition for parish members is \$70 for 1 child; \$120 for 2 children and \$150 for 3 children in the same family. The tuition payment by cash or check is expected at the time of registration.

Religious Education classes are on Sundays, 9-10:15 am. The first day of class is **Sep. 8**.

Because each year builds on the next year of faith formation, students must attend at least 2 consecutive years of Religious Education before a Sacrament is administered and have no more than three absences during the school year. Generally, baptized children receive First Penance/First Holy Communion in grade 2 and higher and Confirmation is received in grade 8 and higher. A student is show evidence of desire and preparation for a Sacrament.

New students need to provide birth and baptismal certificates to register. Parents of unbaptized children under the age of 5 are asked to contact the parish office.

Confirmation: Confirmation is on Monday, **May 13** at 7 pm with Bishop Paul Loverde. Students, wearing their white garment, are to meet in Hannan Hall by 6 pm. Sponsors are to meet at 6:15 pm in the School Library with the Master of Ceremonies. Parents and guests may find designated seats in in the church by 6:45 pm. We ask that students and sponsors go to Confession before **May 13**. Although there is no photography during the Confirmation Mass, families may take pictures during the reception in Hannan Hall.

First Holy Communion: Rehearsal for School and Religious Education students attending the **May 18** Mass in English is Tuesday, **May 14** at 6:30 pm in the church.

Rehearsal for students Religious Education students attending the **May 18** Mass in Spanish is Friday, **May 17** at 6:30 pm in the church. Students are to go to Confession before **May 18**.

Information about First Holy Communion dress, etiquette, and photography has been distributed. Photography forms and payment (checks payable to Maisi Julian Photography) are due to the parish office by 12 noon on **May 15**.

Pastor's Letter

Sacerdos Alter Christus

"The priest is Christ himself."

Maybe it is a bold translation, but it captures the depths of the mystery of the intimate relationship between Jesus Christ, the Eternal High Priest, and his priests.

This Sunday we celebrate "Good Shepherd Sunday." The Gospel reading is taken from John 10: "I am the good shepherd... My sheep hear my voice; I know them, and they follow me. I give them eternal life, and they shall never perish" (Jn 10:11.27-28).

In this beautiful way John's text describes the intimate relationship between Jesus and his disciples. We are his sheep, those He knows by name and who follow his voice.

The Good Shepherd wanted some of his disciples, the priests, to be in a unique place in this relationship. They witness Jesus' work in the souls; they are present when Jesus mercifully heals the broken heart. The priest stands beside the couple when their love becomes the sacrament of Christ's love to the Church. How much love and trust to have his priest there, in that unique communication between the Good Shepherd and his sheep!

Priesthood springs from the depths of Jesus' love to the Father: "As the Father loves me, so I love you" (Jn 15:9) and "As the Father has sent me, so I send you" (Jn 20:21). Jesus loves his priest so much that He wants him to be part of the mystery of his love for us.

No surprise, then, that what Jesus asks his priest in tending to his sheep is to love him more: "Peter, son of John, do you love me more than these?" (Jn 21:15). A total love to Jesus, a "love to the end" (Jn 13:1), is the only possible response of the priest. Love, trust and awe before so great a mystery.

This love to Jesus translates into the respect and reverence with which the priest approaches Jesus' sheep. He is invited to the most inner places of the human heart, that of Jesus and that of the faithful. He witnesses the secret work of the sanctification of souls. With gratitude and wonder the priest lets the master painter work with his paintbrush creating a masterpiece.

The priest will learn his ministry in prayer, contemplating the Good Shepherd and letting him fashion a priestly heart after his own heart (Jer 3:15). Prayer will engrave in the priest's heart the affections, desires and love of Jesus' Heart. In this work of crafting the priestly heart and tuning it to Jesus, Mary has a singular role. She crafted Jesus' heart in Nazareth.

May Mary, mother of the Eternal High Priest and mother of the priests help Jesus' priests to love him more and be Christ for the others, "Alter Christus".

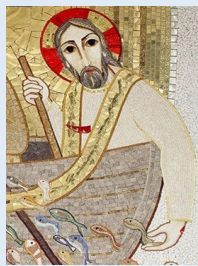

World Day of Prayer for Vocations

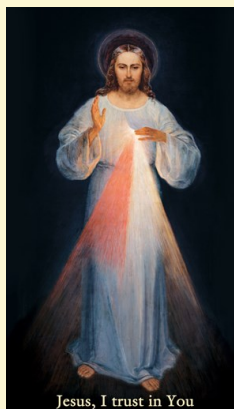
