Joining Our Parish Family

Welcome to Queen of Apostles! We warmly invite you to join our parish family. So that you might receive all of our parish communications, and so that our clergy and staff may respond appropriately to your various sacra-

mental needs, we encourage you to register at Queen of Apostles through the Parish Office. Registration will also be needed to receive a certificate of eligibility to be a Godparent for Baptism; to be a Sponsor for Confirmation; to enroll your child in Religious Education; to begin Baptismal preparation for your child (unless permission is received from your parish); and to prepare for Marriage. Parish registration forms are available in the Church vestibule and at the Parish Office, located at 4329 Sano St. (next door to the Church). Please notify the Parish Office of any family status changes or if you have moved outside of the parish by calling (703) 354-8711, or e-mail general @queenofapostles.org.

Nazareth There is one more Nazareth meeting scheduled for the school year, **Jun. 2**. Sign-in begins at 3:45 pm with activities beginning at 4:00 pm. Parent sign-out is at 5:30 pm. Thanks to the youth leaders and parents for assisting with activities throughout the year!

Emmaus Emmaus is organized for students in high school/college. The group meets with Fr. Juan on Fridays, 6-8 pm at Notre Dame Graduate School (4407 Sano Street) for a faith discussion, adoration, prayer, and other activities, **May 19**. Open Gym is scheduled for the first Friday of the month and the group does not meet on the last Friday of the month. Stay tuned as summer activities are being planned.

Religious Education Religious Education Registration for the **2017-2018** school year is open. QofA's Religious Education program welcomes students from Kindergarten (age 5) through high school. Returning students must register each year. Forms are available during Religious Education, from the parish office, and online: http://queenofapostles.org/wp-content/uploads/RegistrationForm_2017-2018_1andGhanaandHSBible.pdf.

New students need to bring birth and baptismal certificates. The first day of RE is **Sep. 10**.

Registration fees: \$70 for 1 child; \$120 for 2 children; \$150 for 3+ children in the same family. Queen of Apostles parishioners and returning students are given priority for enrollment. We accept cash and check payable to Queen of Apostles. Registration fees do not include fees associated with sacraments.

Students are assigned to the Religious Education grade that parallels his/her public school grade. Students must attend two consecutive years of Religious Education before a sacrament is administered (generally, First Penance/First Holy Communion are received in grade 2 and higher; Confirmation is received in grade 8 and higher). Families with unbaptized children under the age of 7 years old are asked to call the parish office at (703) 354-8711. The remaining Religious Education classes for this school year meet on **May 14**, **21**, **28** and **Jun. 4**. Thank you to our dedicated catechists, aides, and volunteers for helping with the faith formation of QofA's children.

Potluck Breakfast with Religious Education Families, May 21 Religious Education families are invited to attend the **May 21** Potluck Breakfast, in the School's Multipurpose Room at 9 am. While students attend class, families will share food and conversation.

First Holy Communion, June 3 First Holy Communion for Queen of Apostles School students and Religious Education students is Saturday, **Jun. 3**.

For School students and Religious Education students who are attending the **Jun. 3** Mass in English, a <u>mandatory rehearsal</u> is scheduled for Tuesday, **May 30** at 6:30 pm in the church.

For Religious Education students who are attending the **Jun. 3** Mass in Spanish, a <u>mandatory rehearsal</u> is scheduled for Friday, **Jun. 2** at 6:30 pm in the church.

Students and parent/s must attend the rehearsal.

The **Jun. 3** Mass in English begins at 10 am. Students are to meet in Hannan Hall by 9:15 am.

The **Jun. 3** Mass in Spanish begins at 12:30 pm. Students are to meet in Hannan Hall by 11:45 am.

Students are to be dressed, rested, and fed before arriving in Hannan Hall. Parents and guests are to proceed to the church and find a seat quietly.

Please mark your calendar to participate in the **Jun.** 18 Corpus Christi Mass and Procession starting at 12 noon. Students are to attend wearing their First Communion clothes. We ask parents to take students to Confession before the **Jun.** 3 First Holy Communion.

Please pray for our students as they continue to desire and prepare to receive the Body of Christ.

Confirmation, June 11 Desiring and prepared students at Queen of Apostles School, Religious Education, Ghana Catholic Community, and those who are homeschooled, will receive the Sacrament of Confirmation on Jun. 11 at 7 pm. Bishop Michael Burbidge is scheduled as the Confirming Prelate. A mandatory rehearsal is Monday, Jun. 5 at 6:30 pm in the church. Students and Confirmation sponsors must attend the rehearsal.

Update: On **Jun. 11**, students are to meet in Hannan Hall starting at 5:45 pm. Bishop Burbidge is expected to talk with students before the Confirmation Mass. Sponsors are to meet in the School's Multipurpose room starting at 5:45 pm. Fr. Robert Wagner will talk with the sponsors before the Mass. We ask parents/sponsors to take students to Confession before the June 11 Confirmation. Please mark your calendar to participate in the **Jun. 18** Corpus Christi Mass and Procession starting at 12 noon. Students are to attend wearing their Confirmation robes.

Pastor's Letter The Family Fully Alive

Last weekend was a special day of celebration for our Parish Family. Saturday the 13th we celebrated the 100 anniversary of the apparitions of our Lady of Fatima. During this month of May we have a statue of Our Lady of Fatima on the altar to remind us of this occasion as we also celebrate Mary's month. We thank a parishioner family for generously donating the statue for our veneration.

Pope Francis has given plenary indulgences to those who pray to an image of Our Lady of Fatima placed for public veneration in the Church on the 13th of each month from May through October of this year. Last Saturday we could gain it, and we will have Our Lady of Fatima in the Church again each month on the 13th to make it available to the faithful for the grace of the plenary indulgence.

Along with this festivity, we celebrated all together Mother's Day, Fr. Ignacio's 12th Anniversary of Priesthood Ordination and the Pastor's Birthday. I want to wholeheartedly give thanks for your sincere affection and joy in celebrating with Fr. Ignacio and me last Sunday.

These celebrations had in common the joy and gratitude for the many blessings God gives us and for those persons who bring meaning and greatness to our lives, those who devote themselves to make us fully alive.

At this point of the year, when we are also celebrating graduations, the end of the school year... before we take our summer break, I would like to ask if we are growing and becoming more fully alive. That is the program we are running this year: *Towards a Family Fully Alive*. We want to help you to strengthen your family relations with those who are closest to you in the journey of life. On a monthly basis we focus on each of the threads that intertwine the fabric of our family life: mothers, fathers, grandparents, siblings... We also pray for them and give them a special blessing.

Each of us will be "fully alive" to the extent that we are connected with the source of our life and identity, to the extent that we recognize ourselves as children, as brothers or sisters, as fathers or mothers. Only going back to my origin will I find the strength and the power to move forward.

This is why we are also proposing the monthly "rule of life." Because God is the ultimate foundation of my life, I will be fully alive if I am deeply connected with Him. Do I want to be holy? Do I want to grow and strive in my faith? Is my faith just a set of routines or is it my inspiration and the driving force of my life?

At this point of the year, let's ask about our growth. We want to be a Family Fully Alive. Is it happening?



Rule of Life for the Month of May: Lectio Divina

(MAY) Lectio Divina "And Mary kept all these things, reflecting on them in her heart" (Lk 2:19). In May, we go to the school of Mary to learn the art of Lectio Divina, an ancient tradition of prayerful reading of the Bible through four steps:

Lectio - reading/listening

Meditatio - letting Scripture wash over my thoughts, hopes, memories, and desires *Oratio* - loving conversation with God

Contemplatio - a wordless and quiet presence of the One Who loves us

- **♦** Step 1: Enthrone the Bible at home in a prominent place.
- ❖Step 2: Once a week read the Bible for 10 minutes.
- ❖Step 3: Learn the 4 steps of Lectio Divina.
