PASTOR'S LETTER

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ Jesus.

This Sunday, we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, the greatest and most profound mystery of our faith, and only through faith can we understand it. Today, we will worship our God, who is Father, Son and Holy Spirit. One God in three Persons, in the name of whom we have been baptized. By the grace of Baptism, we are called to have a part in the life of the Holy Trinity. Through Baptism, we have been made participants in the divine life, becoming children of the Father God, brothers and sisters in Christ and temples of the Holy Spirit. In Baptism, our Christian life began, receiving the vocation to holiness. Baptism makes us belong to the One who is the Holy One par excellence, the "three times holy" (Is 6, 3). I ask you with deep gratitude for the gracious plan of our God, who has called us to participate in His life of love, that we adore and praise Him today and always: "Blessed be God the Father, and his only Son, and the Holy Spirit because he has had mercy on us."

This week, our bishop asks us to return to normal life in our diocese. In the bulletin, you will find the new guidelines. The changes are effective at midnight on Friday, May 28. I ask you for prudence to follow them since the virus has not yet been completely eradicated, and we still have many brothers and sisters who still do not feel comfortable with the new guidelines. As I explained a few months ago, we must obey our bishop, and we will do so; those who wish to continue using the mask out of personal precaution can continue to do so. For now, we will continue to disinfect the temple for a few more months, and we will see how everything returns to normal.

Next weekend is the Solemnity of Corpus Christi, a day to worship Jesus in the Eucharist. We will have the Eucharistic procession on Saturday June 5, and we will celebrate a bilingual Mass at 5:00 pm, and then we will have the Eucharistic procession through the parking lot; We will have five altars that will be prepared by the different groups and ministries of our parish, I advise you that we will not have the 7:00 pm Mass so that we can have more time for the procession. I invite everyone to participate. I hope everyone can attend so that together we pray for the intentions of our diocese and our parish. Likewise, that day, I will also consecrate the new Extraordinary Ministers of the Eucharist, whom I thank in advance for their commitment to serve. All ministers are invited to participate in the procession, as it is their main feast.

Also, I announce that the Chapel of Perpetual Adoration will be reopened starting the first week of July We have four weeks to prepare and make the calendar of worshipers, and I plan to open it gradually because I don't know if we have an adequate number of worshipers. If you want to take an hour to pray, please contact the parish office and leave your information and so we will have the certainty of how many want to be part of this ministry that is the spiritual lung of our parish.

Now that we are back to normal, I hope to meet you all and to enjoy our faith encounters again; I am very happy because we will soon return to almost normal life after this ordeal.

I have you in my prayers; I always ask the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit to bless you abundantly.

Registration for the 2021-2022 Religious Education school year is open! Current RE families may register on Sunday mornings during RE classes, or, families may stop by the parish office. The RE Program at Queen of Apostles is available to parish youth in grades kindergarten (age 5) - high school. In-person classes will be held on Sunday mornings, 10:30-11:45am beginning on Sept 12, 2021. Queen of Apostles parishioners and returning students are given priority for enrollment. Class size is limited as we balance safety protocols with student learning and faith formation. Non-parishioners will be placed on a wait list until Aug 1, 2021. Birth and baptismal certificates for new students are to be provided at the time of registration. Because each year builds on the next year of faith formation, students must attend at least two consecutive years of Religious Education before a grade/ age-appropriate Sacrament is administered, have no more than three absences during the school year, and score at least 70% on tests. Generally, baptized children receive First Penance/ First Holy Communion in grade 2 and higher and Confirmation is received in grade 8 and higher. A student is to show evidence of desire and preparation for a Sacrament. Families with unbaptized children under the age of 7 years old are to contact the parish office.

RCIA

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) is the process through which adults join or complete his/her initiation into the Roman Catholic Church. If interested in attending RCIA for the next school year, **Sept 2021-June 2022**, please contact Susan Gray at 703-354-8711 or s.gray@queenofapostles.org, or talk with a priest.

Altar Servers

If your son (grade 4 and above) is willing to serve at Holy Mass on Sundays at 8am, 10am, 12noon in English, Mass in Spanish at 7pm on Saturdays or 1:30pm on Sundays, and other Masses, please send a message to s.gray@queenofapostles.org or talk with Fr. Rampino. Generally, boys serve every other weekend. Boys who are serving Mass are asked to arrive no less than 15 min before Mass, wear dress shoes, bring a face mask, use the upper sacristy, and wait for the priest. Thank you for participating in this ministry.

Catechist, Aides, and Volunteers for RE

For the 2021-2022 Religious Education school year, we seek practicing Catholics who love the Catholic faith and want to help develop the faith in our youth. As sowers of the Gospel, catechists ,aides, substitutes, and volunteers (are needed on Sunday mornings for inperson classes. Class time is 75 minutes and planning time is about 1-2 hours per week. Younger, older, single, married, male and female are welcome to apply to serve this ministry. We provide you with materials, support, and opportunities to attend Diocesan and parish workshops and obtain certification. Attendance at a Virtus seminar and completion of Virginia Background Check paperwork are required. On **Aug 28**, Fr. Rampino will lead a workshop for catechists that will review the Pope's recent "motu proprio" and the establishment of the lay ministry of catechist. 



Response to Coronavirus Public Celebrations of Mass

Diocese of Arlington

Guide for the Lay Faithful May 25, 2021

Changes are based upon direction from Bishop Burbidge based upon the recent release of Executive Order 79.

What To Know

On May 28, Executive Order (EO 79) lifts nearly all previous directives. It changes masks requirements. Our churches will follow these changes and operate similar to pre-COVID-19.

- Dispensation · All the faithful of the Diocese of Arlington are dispensed from the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and holydays of obligation until further notice. At this time, the dispensation remains in effect. Further announcements regarding this matter will be conveyed in the near future.
- **Schedules** Bishop Burbidge has requested that all parishes return to pre-COVID schedules for Mass, Adoration, and access to the parish.
- **Livestreamed Masses** At the pastor's discretion, livestreamed Masses may continue for the benefit of the homebound.
- **Person-Per-Gathering Limits** Per EO 79, there are no gathering limitations. Parishioners should expect to see larger crowds as they return to Mass.
- **Social Distancing** Per EO 79, there are no social distancing requirements.
- **Disinfecting** Per EO 79, there are no pandemic-like requirements for disinfecting and cleaning. Parishes should still continue a reasonable and effective cleaning regimen.

Preparing

- Face Coverings Parishes shall follow the guidelines of EO 79 and the CDC's "Interim Recommendations for Fully Vaccinated People":
 - Fully vaccinated persons no longer need to wear a mask in any setting.
 - Unvaccinated persons are encouraged to wear face coverings per EO 79.
 - No one shall inquire into the vaccination status of parishioners.
 - No one shall be barred from entering a church or facility for not wearing a face covering.


- **Sign-ups** Because there are no gathering limits, sign-up platforms will be discontinued.
- **Hand Hygiene** Parishes have the *option* of providing hand sanitizer.

Celebrating

- **Liturgical Elements** The following liturgical elements that were suspended or modified may now be reintroduced:
 - Holy water in fonts
 - Worship aids
 - Singing by full choirs and the faithful
 - Collection baskets
 - Presentation of the gifts by the lay faithful
 - The sign of peace (without physical contact between non-family members)

Communion

- The Diocese continues to suppresses the distribution of the Precious Blood until further notice.
- At the pastor's discretion deacons, instituted acolytes, and Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion may distribute Communion.
- Parishioners should follow the procedures of their parish for the distribution of Communion.
- Each communicant retains the right to decide how to receive, either on the tongue or in the hand.
- It is not permitted to receive Communion in the hand while wearing gloves. If you are wearing gloves and will receive Communion in the hand, please remove your gloves prior to the reception of Communion.

Guía para los fieles laicos

Cambios efectuados bajo la dirección de Monseñor Burbidge de conformidad con la reciente publicación de la Orden Ejecutiva 79.

Lo que deben saber

El 28 de mayo, por medio de la Orden Ejecutiva (EO 79) se cancelan casi todas las directrices anteriores. Se cambian los requisitos sobre el uso de máscaras. Nuestras Iglesias seguirán estos cambios y funcionarán de manera similar a la establecida antes de la COVID-19.

- Dispensa. Todos los fieles de la Diócesis de Arlington están dispensados de la obligación de asistir a la Misa los domingos y días de obligación hasta nuevo aviso. En este momento, la dispensa sigue en vigor. Se enviarán otros anuncios al respecto en el futuro próximo.
- **Horarios** Monseñor Burbidge ha solicitado que todas las parroquias vuelvan al horario de Misas, Adoración y acceso a las parroquias existente antes de la COVID.
- Misas transmitidas en vivo · A discreción del párroco, se pueden seguir transmitiendo las Misas en vivo para beneficio de las personas confinadas a la casa.
- Limitaciones del número de personas por reunión · Según la Orden Ejecutiva 79, no hay limitación para las reuniones. Los feligreses deben esperar que haya una mayor congregación de fieles cuando vuelvan a la Misa.
- **Distanciamiento social** Según la Orden Ejecutiva 79, no hay requisitos de distanciamiento social.
- **Desinfección** Según la Orden Ejecutiva 79, no hay requisitos de desinfección y limpieza como los establecidos durante la pandemia. Las parroquias deben seguir con un régimen de limpieza razonable y efectivo.

Preparación

- Cobertura facial Las parroquias deben seguir las directrices de la Orden Ejecutiva 79 y las recomendaciones interinas para las personas totalmente vacunadas, establecidas por los Centros para el Control y la Prevención de Enfermedades (CDC):
 - Las personas totalmente vacunadas ya no necesitan usar máscara en ningún lugar.
 - Se anima a las personas no vacunadas a llevar una cobertura facial, de conformidad con lo dispuesto en la Orden Ejecutiva 79.

- Nadie preguntará si los feligreses se han vacunado o no.
- A nadie se le impedirá entrar a una iglesia o a cualquier edificación por no usar cobertura facial.
- Plataformas de firmas para reuniones Puesto que no hay límites para reunirse, se descontinuarán las plataformas de firmas para reuniones.
- Higiene de las manos · Las parroquias tienen la opción de proporcionar desinfectante para las manos.

Celebración

- Elementos litúrgicos · Los siguientes elementos litúrgicos previamente suspendidos o modificados pueden volver a introducirse:
 - Agua bendita en las fuentes
 - Ayudas para el culto
 - Canto del coro y de los fieles
 - Canastas de colecta
 - Presentación de las ofrendas por los fieles laicos
 - La señal de la paz (sin contacto físico entre personas que no son familiares)

Gospel Commentary for The Most Holy Trinity: The Incomprehensible Love

"Go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit." Christ gives this great command to His disciples in the Gospel passage for this Trinity Sunday, giving us the description of God that forms the heart of our Christian belief. Naming God as Father, Son, and Holy Spirit marks every aspect of our Catholic life, framing each of our prayers and liturgies, even, as Christ taught us, bringing us into the Christian Church to the begin with on the day of our Baptism. It is good for us each year to remind ourselves exactly what it means for us to call God Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, and why we should give thanks that we are able to do so, why this very fact matters for us.

First, we need to remember and reaffirm exactly what we believe about the Blessed Trinity. We believe that there is only on God, one divine nature, that exists without beginning or end, outside of time, in three persons. The three persons, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, share one nature, one immortality, one power, one knowledge, one will, one glory, one love. They are distinguished from one another only by their relationships to one another: the Son is exactly like the Father in everything except in that He is the Son and not the Father, and so on. Though distinct, they are inseparable, and always act together, meaning that even though we often think of the Father as the one who created all things and acted in the Old Testament, the Son as the one who saved us from our sins, and the Holy Spirit as the one who works holiness and spiritual growth in the world, the truth is that all three persons are active together in every moment. There can be no separation or distance between the persons. The Father is the source without source, who generates the Son, who in turn loves the Father who generates Him, and the bond of love between them is the Spirit, all things taking place without beginning or end, outside of all time and space, a dynamo of love that is the ground of reality itself. Though this is all simplifying a mystery that will always be beyond our capacity to fully understand and grasp, these are the things we can say with certainty about who God is.

But what effect does this have, and why should we be grateful to know and believe all of it? The first thing to consider is that we only know that God is a trinity because He Himself has told us. He did not have to reveal Himself to us at all. He could have left His nature a total mystery, saving us through commandments and teaching alone. He could have sent prophets to us with miracles and signs, simply to tell us to behave rightly, and that would have been more than enough. But of course, God is not merely interested in our good behavior, as important as it is. He calls us to a good moral life so that we can become capable of sustaining the intensity of a life shared with Him, since while we sin and carry sin on our souls, we cannot bear the weight of His glory. He is interested in sharing His own self with us, drawing us into His family, and giving us a place in His home, even if our minds are too small to comprehend His identity totally.

The question we have to ask ourselves is how our hearts and minds respond to this revelation and invitation. Do we want God to call us into friendship? Do we want our lives to be taken up entirely into Him, into the love of the three divine Persons? Would we prefer a religion that guides our morals and worldly outlook, but that leaves us mostly to our own devices and plans, or do we really with to meet God and find ourselves in Him? Are we willing to let go of sins and fears, accepting inconveniences and crosses, in order to receive this gift, which is greater than our capacity to receive? The way we answer will determine our life of faith here on Earth, and the nature of our eternity. No matter what we have chosen in the past, let's steer our hearts to choose the divine adventure, and accept no substitutes for the greatest of all possible love.


