**Religious Education** The Religious Education registration for public school and homeschool students in kindergarten (age 5) - high school is now open! Parents of current students can pick up the registration form on-site during RE class time. Tuition for parish members is \$70 for 1 child; \$120 for 2 children and \$150 for 3 children in the same family. The tuition payment by cash or check is expected at the time of registration.

Religious Education classes are on Sundays, 9-10:15 am. The first day of class is **Sep. 8**. Because each year builds on the next year of faith formation, students must attend at least 2 consecutive years of Religious Education before a Sacrament is administered and have no more than three absences during the school year. Generally, baptized children receive First Penance/First Holy Communion in grade 2 and higher and Confirmation is received in grade 8 and higher. A student is show evidence of desire and preparation for a Sacrament. New students need to provide birth and baptismal certificates to register. Parents of unbaptized children under the age of 5 are asked to contact the parish office.

**Confirmation:** Rehearsal for all Confirmation students and their sponsors is Friday, **May 10** at 6:30 pm in the church. Following the rehearsal white garments that are to be worn by students during Confirmation will be distributed. Information about dress and photography is provided on pages 18-20 of the Confirmation packet. Per Diocesan guidelines, there will be no photography/video during the Confirmation Liturgy.

Confirmation is on Monday, **May 13** at 7 pm. Students, wearing their white garment, are to meet in Hannan Hall by 6 pm. Sponsors are to meet at 6:15 pm in the School Library with the Master of Ceremonies. Parents and guests may find designated seats in in the church. Students and sponsors are to go to Confession before **May 13**.

**First Holy Communion:** Rehearsal for School and Religious Education students attending the **May 18** Mass in English is Tuesday, **May 14** at 6:30 pm in the church.

Rehearsal for students Religious Education students attending the **May 18** Mass in Spanish is Friday, **May 17** at 6:30 pm in the church. Students are to go to Confession before **May 18**.

Information about First Holy Communion dress, etiquette, and photography has been distributed. Photography forms and payment (checks payable to Maisi Julian Photography) are due to the parish office by 12 noon on **May 15**.

## Pastor's Letter

### Technology: more freedom or more control?

We can find every day breaking news about technological progress. Autonomous cars are already moving around us and most likely will be the standard in the near future. Autonomous planes are close behind. 5G, smartphones, smart speakers like "Alexa"... But a poignant question arises: more technology, is it more freedom or more control?

Today's Gospel brings us to the Sea of Galilee, when Jesus revealed himself again to his disciples (Jn 21:1-19). It is a beautiful exemplification of how without Jesus we can do nothing (Jn 15:5). They were skilled fishermen, knowledgeable professionals; however they failed. Left to themselves, their efforts were fruitless; with Jesus, however, they made a big catch. And this is the lesson: we should put our trust in the Lord more than in our abilities. Letting Jesus take charge will pay back.

Today's Catholics are greatly challenged. Both from inside and outside the Church. Scandals inside; secularization outside. The temptation is to think that we can fix the things relying on our ability. We know the art of fishing. We are familiar with this Sea. So we will toil all night and catch nothing.

The apostles learned the lesson. And they were strong enough not to fear the Sanhedrin and even rejoice "that they had been found worthy to suffer dishonor for the sake of the name" (Acts 5:41).

Contemplating the miraculous fishing we are invited to put our trust in God and his power. Discipleship and Evangelization are not human-size endeavors. They are a God-size mission. So we need to rely on God's power and grace.

As we move forward in today's Gospel, there is more. When Jesus is about to confirm Peter as the rock upon which He will build his Church, the test is "Do you love me?" (Jn 21:15).

Next weekend will be Good Shepherd Sunday and the world day of prayer for vocations. Let's pray the Lord of the harvest to send laborers into his harvest (Mt 9:38; Lk 10:2). Let's pray the Lord to give us "shepherds after his own heart" (Jer. 3:15). Priests and Bishops who love Jesus with a genuine priestly heart. Shepherds whose love for Jesus would inspire us when we see them praying, celebrating Mass or other sacraments. Men who found a treasure and sold everything to devote themselves to love Jesus and his Church, serving her as Jesus did, with the sacrifice of their lives. Men who have taken to heart the Bishop's invitation: "Receive from the Holy People of God the gifts to be offered to God. Know what you do, imitate what you celebrate, and conform your life to the mystery of the Lord's cross."

Technology is today's paradigm of human power. But we build on another power: the power of the one who "has loved me and given himself up for me" (Gal 2:20).

Blessed Virgin Mary, who can worthily repay you with praise and thanks for having rescued a fallen world by your generous consent! Receive our gratitude, and by your prayers obtain the pardon of our sins. Take our prayers into the sanctuary of heaven and enable them to make our peace with God.

Holy Mary, help the miserable, strengthen the discouraged, comfort the sorrowful, pray for your people, plead for the clergy, intercede for all women consecrated to God. May all who venerate you feel now your help and protection. Be ready to help us when we pray, and bring back to us the answers to our prayers. Make it your continual concern to pray for the people of God, for you were blessed by God and were made worthy to bear the Redeemer of the world, who lives and reigns forever. Amen.

### **Parish Special Needs Second Collection on May 12**


