Pastor's Letter

November reminds us of our call to greatness. We began the month with the Solemnity of All Saints, inviting us to grow in desire for an intimacy, a communion with God, as did the psalmist: "One thing I ask of the Lord; this is seek: to dwell in the Lord's house all the days of my life, to gaze on the Lord's beauty, to visit his temple." (Psalm 27)



This pilgrimage toward this communion with God passes through the fine curtain of death, the moment at which our hearts will be examined. Our faith tells us that that there is heaven and hell, and that given our brokenness and sinfulness some who are destined to enter heaven must first be purified in purgatory. The month of November is dedicated to prayer and offering sacrifices for the faithful departed who dwell in purgatory, invoking God's mercy upon them. Consider this month offering for a loved one a Mass, a rosary as a family, or a visit to the adoration chapel. This is part of the greatness of our faith. Because we are a Communion of Faith, we can request the intercession of the saints who already contemplate the face of God in heaven, and, in turn, we can pray for the souls in purgatory.

During the month of November, the Church makes present in a special way the things that will occur to man at the end of his life: death, judgment, heaven, hell. "Death puts an end to human life as the time open to either accepting or rejecting the divine grace manifested in Christ" (Catechism of the Catholic Church, 1021). "In a particular judgment that refers his life to Christ: either entrance into the blessedness of heaven – through a purification or immediately – or immediate and everlasting damnation." (CCC 1022) "At the evening of life, we shall be judged on our love," according to St. John of the Cross.

The Liturgy invites all of us this month to meditate on these truths, as the liturgical year comes to an end. On the last Sunday of the Liturgical year, we will celebrate Christ the King. Our pilgrimage on this earth is a preparation to meet this King who happens to be Love itself. May God's grace help us turn back to the Lord, to walk with the hope of one who desires that fullness of life in an intimate communion with God.
