Pastor's Letter

The seminarian who visited last week, Peter St. George, for Vocations Awareness Weekend, had an opportunity to partake in some of our regular weekend activities. On Saturday evening, he joined the Emmaus youth group for Holy Hour in the chapel of the Christendom building. The next day, following the 7:30 AM Mass, we visited with several classrooms in the Religious Education Program, which is truly thriving! We have 20 catechists and 8 volunteers serving a total of 172 students (K-12), many of whom have already received sacraments but continue to attend. This year, we have introduced a series of talks in Spanish to offer parents an opportunity to continue forming themselves while their children are in class. A group of volunteers are leading talks on the first 1000 years of Church history. RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults) is also bursting at the seams with many adults wanting to join our Catholic faith or to receive a sacrament they had not received. Fr. James is leading a group of 12 adults in English, and Fr. Javier is leading a group of 12 in Spanish. Both groups meet Monday evenings.

After Peter spoke at all the Masses on Sunday and before lunch, he and I went to visit one of our long-time ushers – Mr. Kim Ching. You may recall that he suffered a fall in the vestibule and has been recovering since. Mr. Ching, 94 years old, served as an usher at Queen of Apostles for approximately 37 years. It was an amazing visit and very opportune given that the next day was Veteran's day. Mr. Ching served in the Air Force. Mr. Ching promised to continue to pray for our parish, especially for the gift of vocations. Our homebound form an incredible army that offer their sufferings and prayers for us. I am edified by his serenity in carrying his cross; in the hours I have shared with him, I have never heard one complaint. God bless him.

Speaking of vocations, did you know that another young man professed temporary vows (3 years) of poverty, chastity and obedience with our religious order? Erik Reuter is the third native of Colorado to begin his formation to the priesthood as a member of the Disciples. In addition, there are four other recent high school graduates from Colorado who are spending a year in our House of Formation in Spain desiring to confirm God's plan for them. I look forward to a time when young men from Queen of Apostles will also want to serve God and his Church in the family of the Disciples.

During our 9 AM Mass this Sunday, to begin Discover Catholic Schools Week strong, we will offer a special blessing to our Queen of Apostles school teachers. Under this school year's theme, *That you may have life*, our very dedicated and talented teachers continue to form our students in virtues, through practices as well as great literature. Fr. James, school chaplain, has introduced a great program at the school; it began one week ago with the fourth graders. This week, offer a prayer for our teachers, call and schedule a visit to our school. Come see what's new!

As November continues, let us lift our hearts and our thoughts to great things. It is an opportunity to remember our own call to a union with God and to consider how I can direct my life and my relationships toward him.

What's new at the school? I am glad to share with you a beautiful program that began on November 8, during the school Mass. It is called Post Sacramental Program and it is addressed to grades 4th through 8th. The goal of this program is to help our students understand and live the sacraments as new paths that are opened the moment the sacrament is received. We are not done the moment we receive the sacrament; rather, they become a new beginning that lead us to heaven. In order to maintain that tension we have the help of sacramentals, signs that reminds us who we are and what we are called to. Sacramentals predispose us to receive God's grace.



Every grade will receive a sign in a ceremony that will take place within the Friday's school Mass. Already our 4th graders received from their parents the Scapular as a reminder and a sign that they have Mary as a mother and intercessor. Many parents attended the Mass and were able to impose the Scapular to their own children. On November 22nd, our 5th graders will receive the Rosary and will commit to pray it on a regular basis. It would be our pleasure and an honor if you could assist the School Mass and share with us this path. Look forward to seeing you there!

2018-19 Annual Report

Long overdue, we are attaching to this bulletin the financial report – our income and balance sheet statements - for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2019. Looking into the future, we are working on a strategy to make our school sustainable. Already, our new school principal is finding ways to reduce expenses, and together we are putting together a plan to increase our enrollment. The Capital Campaign will help us make some needed upgrades in our school. So as to not add more financial burdens to the parish, we are also seeking alternative ways to address unexpected needs, such as asking parishioner volunteers to help paint different areas of the school and to temporarily address leaks in our roof. Next, we need to replace the computers that our teachers use. Windows 7 is becoming obsolete and our current systems are too old for the new software.

The income statement shows a total expense of \$540,280. These have to do with capital expenditures. In anticipation of Capital Campaign funds, some investments were made prior to the funds being available. These investments include the new organ, consulting fees for the Capital Campaign feasibility study, and architectural fees for initial designs. The expenditures also include expenses associated with the renovation of the new property acquired by Queen of Apostles on Applegarth Court, right beside the school building currently used by Christendom College.

"Other Liabilities" in the balance sheet total \$547,802. This represents money in our bank accounts that belong to the Ghana Catholic Community. And the "Loans Payable" total, \$362,905, is the loan associated with the new property mentioned above.

As we move forward, I am collaborating with our Finance Council and using diocesan resources for guidance to strengthen our finances. In this vein, we are seeking ways to keep you informed of the status and challenges of our parish family. Beginning today, we include the weekly collection totals in the bulletin for your information. Your offertory donations help us address ordinary expenses (i.e., salaries, utilities, etc.). The second collections (with the exception of the school collections) are forwarded directly to the diocese, who manages these monies.

Thank you for your continued generosity, and for trusting us to be good stewards.
