## PASTOR'S LETTER

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ Jesus:

I hope that this short message finds you well and that your spiritual and physical health are getting stronger every day. Gradually, we are approaching the end of the liturgical year, and it is time to begin to examine ourselves if we grew in our inner life or did not. I know that this year has been challenging because of everything we have lived through, and we continue to live, but I am sure that thanks to God's goodness and mercy, we have overcome the fear, doubt, and sadness that all this has brought us. I want to invite all of you to practice what the Gospel of this Sunday tells us, "keep the lamps burning," and with enough oil to continue fighting with the faith and grace of God and not let ourselves faint. Hopefully, this pandemic will soon pass, but our faith has to become more substantial and solid. Hopefully, we make this pandemic a ladder to go up to heaven.

I want to thank the support towards the Capital Campaign for the reconstruction of some areas of our Sanctuary, that support has already begun to bear fruit; As you have been able to realize in the last week of October, we installed a new and modern sound system, now we can understand the word of God more clearly. We have also already installed the new altar lights; many bulbs have been burned out for many years., now we can enjoy the beauty of our altar; Many of you have told me that you enjoy the beauty of the altar more and that you had not realized how big and beautiful it is. These projects are just the first part of all. I inform you that the ceiling and the Sanctuary walls' painting will begin in the coming weeks. The architects have also advised me to change the apostles' background color to a lighter color; the purple makes the altar look opaque and less vibrant. I'm working on this new project to give more life and beauty to our Lord's house. I hope you support me. I look forward to furthering improvements.

Changing the subject a bit, we have already started working on the Christmas activities, which is less than two months away; I know it will be different this year, and it will be like that, only if we allow ourselves to be won over by pessimism and fear. We are getting ready for our first Christmas Festival on December 19 in the church parking lot from 5 to 10 pm. We will have a live nativity, a petting zoo, live Christmas caroling, a bonfire, and food. The purpose is to make our children and also us adults, for a moment, stop to contemplate the manger of Jesus and forget about this challenging situation. Please mark your calendar now because it will be a special day for everyone.

Finally, this week we received a message from our bishop regarding the celebrations of Masses for Christmas. I would like you to consider if you plan to participate because depending on the number that attends, this will be the number of Masses that we will schedule. The objective is that everyone who wishes to attend can participate and that together we contemplate and meditate on the birth of Jesus. Therefore, three weeks before Christmas, you will receive more details about it.

I ask you to pray for us; leading the parish in these times is not easy, but I know that you support us with your prayers.

## Religious Education Information

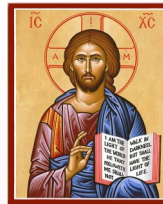
**Info:** Grade 8-high school students who are eligible for the Sacrament of Confirmation are to attend a retreat on **Saturday, Nov 21, 2020 or on Jan 16, 2021** at Queen of Apostles, 8:30am~3:30pm. A survey will be sent to parents indicating the preferred retreat date.

The Sacrament of Confirmation packet is posted on our website. QofA School students/families are to confirm due dates/projects with the school teacher, Miss Hang.

For in person Religious Education classes, doors will open at **8:30am** and students are asked to arrive no later than **8:45am** for the **9am** class. Please park close to the school and escort your child to the check-in. Students will enter the school and find his/her classroom. Parents are to meet their student/s along the walkways near the school by **10:15 a.m.**

For students using MyCatholicFaithDelivered.com (MCFD) + a monthly Sunday morning class via Zoom (with the catechist and in-person class) homework assignments are emailed to the class MCFD group. About once a month, two grades per week will Zoom into the in-person class. A parent is to accompany the student during the Zoom video during the 9-10:15am Sunday morning class time

**Safety:** On-site, temperatures will be checked and questions about COVID symptoms will be asked. Family members displaying any symptoms are not to attend RE class. To comply with safety protocols, class size is limited, 6' distance between families/students, masks/face shields are to be worn by everyone, hand sanitizer will be used upon entering the school building, students will report directly to class, *only catechists, aides, and registration volunteers may enter the school*, and disinfection will occur before and after classes. Students must bring his/her own pen/pencil, paper, hand sanitizer, etc. to class. Please, no sharing of supplies.

## November 9: Dedication of the Lateran Basilica

Today the Church celebrates the feast of the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica in Rome, the oldest and highest ranking of the four major basilicas in Rome. The Basilica of St. John Lateran is the cathedral of the diocese of Rome, the official ecclesiastical seat of the Holy Father, the Bishop of Rome, not St. Peter's Basilica as so many mistakenly believe. It is the oldest church in the West, built in the time of Constantine and was consecrated by Pope Sylvester in 324. This feast became a universal celebration in honor of the archbasilica, the ecclesiastical mother church, called "the mother and mistress of all churches of Rome and the world" (omnium urbis et orbis ecclesiarum mater et caput), as a sign of love for and union with the See of Peter.

# Gospel Commentary for the 32nd Sunday in Ordinary Time: Deciding Now for God

In 1849, at the age of seven, after making his first Holy Communion, St. Dominic Savio wrote a series of resolutions in his personal notebook. He declared the following: "I will go to confession often, and to Holy Communion as often as my confessor allows, I will keep Sundays particularly holy, my friends will be Jesus and Mary, and I will choose death rather than sin." Even at such a young age, this young man had seen clearly that which was most important in life, and with great wisdom, laid the groundwork necessary to remain secure in his Christian faith. Even as a youth, he had made decisions about his life that we might expect from people many times older than him, people who had lived long enough to spend time following their own will and desires, realize the emptiness of a life apart from God, and finally turn back to their faith in repentance.

Perhaps others might look at someone like St. Dominic and think that he ought to have tasted all the world had to offer before deciding to give it up, that there is more than enough time to repent once a person's own goals and desires are accomplished. A more subtle form of this temptation might be to tell oneself that there will be time to pray and turn to the Lord once the work or crisis of the day or of the moment has past. On the other side of the to-do list, there will be space to think of heavenly things.

This was perhaps the mindset of the five foolish maidens in Christ's parable this Sunday. They may not have brought oil enough for their lamps simply because they thought that their entrance into the wedding feast was already a sure thing. Their uncaring and carefree attitude suggests that they do not think they really need the bridegroom. They treat him lightly, as someone for whom they do not have to prepare, a person of no real consequence, an option to be taken when all other pleasant things have passed.

This mindset, of course, forgets the uncertainty of our future. St. Dominic Savio was in fact, called early to the house of the Lord, at the age of fourteen. In his last days, he remained calm and peaceful, knowing that he was close to the heart of Jesus, and his last words as he passed from this life were, "oh what beautiful things I see!" The choices he made to remain close to God when he was seven proved themselves truly wise. Had Dominic put off his conversion and devotion, if he had decided that there would be time for friendship with God once he had lived his life and settled down, once he had finished the work he wanted to do and achieved the goals he had set for himself in the world, his peaceful passage to eternity might not have been so sure. Rather than meeting the end of his life in peace and confidence, he would have had to contend with the fear and anxiety of going through a conversion in the space of a moment, or perhaps he would have grown bitter in heart at his misfortune and not returned to God at all.

Following the example of this young saint, we too should decide today to turn to the Lord with real dedication, asking that He convert whatever in our hearts is not yet with Him. We do not know if we will have tomorrow, so now is the time to make preparation for eternity by allowing the Lord to love us, and truly loving Him in return, taking His will as our own, and following the commandments in true wisdom.
