Catholic Adult but Not Confirmed? Interested in Becoming Catholic? RCIA Classes in English and Spanish Begin Monday, Sept 16 The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) is the process through which adults join or complete their initiation into the Roman Catholic Church. RCIA is for three groups of adults:

- 1. Those who are not baptized.
- 2. Those who were baptized into another Christian denomination and wish to enter into full communion with the Catholic Church.
- 3. Baptized Catholics who were not fully formed in the Catholic faith and have not completed their initiation: those who have not received the Sacraments of Confirmation and/or Eucharist.



RCIA classes are held on Monday nights, Sept **16**, **2019** - June **8**, **2020**, **7:30-9pm**. Fr. Jaime de Cendra will lead classes in English at the Parish Family Center (4329 Sano Street) while Fr. Javier O'Connor will lead classes in Spanish at Christendom College Graduate School (4407 Sano Street, Alexandria, VA). Books are provided. Please register by contacting the

Religious Education Classes have Begun! Religious Education classes, held at Queen of Apostles School, have begun. Classes meet on Sundays 9-10:15am. # I Came to Bring Fire: Meditations on the Gospel By Fr. Armando Marsal, DCJM

Tax collectors and sinners were all drawing near to listen to Jesus, but the Pharisees and scribes began to complain, saying, "This man welcomes sinners and eats with them." So to them he addressed this parable. "What man among you having a hundred sheep and losing one of them would not leave the ninety-nine in the desert and go after the lost one until he finds it? And when he does find it, he sets it on his shoulders with great joy and, upon his arrival home, he calls



together his friends and neighbors and says to them, 'Rejoice with me because I have found my lost sheep.' I tell you, in just the same way there will be more joy in heaven over one sinner who repents than over ninety-nine righteous people who have no need of repentance. Or what woman having ten coins and losing one would not light a lamp and sweep the house, searching carefully until she finds it? And when she does find it, she calls together her friends and neighbors and says to them, 'Rejoice with me because I have found the coin that I lost.' In just the same way, I tell you, there will be rejoicing among the angels of God over one sinner who repents." (Luke 15:1-10)

#### My Conversion Gives Joy in Heaven

Conversion is an essential and necessary part of our pilgrimage toward God. In fact, only the one who converts walks toward Heaven. This stage of conversion is constitutive of being on the way. Actually the disposition of conversion marks the deepest dimension of the whole Church; it means walking toward an encounter with the One who is love and is calling us to be transformed in love.

Authentic knowledge of the God of mercy, the God of tender love, is a constant and inexhaustible source of conversion, not only as a momentary interior act but also as a permanent attitude, as a state of mind. Those who come to know God in this way, who "see" him in this way, can live only in a state of being continually converted to him. They live, therefore, in statu conversionis (condition of conversion, being in continual conversion); and it is this state of conversion which marks out the most profound element of the pilgrimage of every man and woman on earth in statu viatoris (condition of pilgrimage of being in the way). (Saint John Paul II, God Rich in Mercy, VII, 136)

We are called to be as Jesus: "For those whom he foreknew he also predestined to be conformed to the image of his Son" (Rm 8:29).
