Catholic Adult but Not Confirmed? Interested in Becoming Catholic? Join RCIA The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) is the process through which adults join or complete their initiation into the Roman Catholic Church.

RCIA is for three groups of adults:

- 1. Those who are not baptized.
- 2. Those who were baptized into another Christian denomination and wish to enter into full communion with the Catholic Church.
- 3. Baptized Catholics who were not fully formed in the Catholic faith and have not completed their initiation: those who have not received the Sacraments of Confirmation and/or Eucharist.

RCIA classes are held from **Sep. 2018** - **Jun. 2019**. Fr. Javier O'Connor leads RCIA classes in English on Mondays and in Spanish on Wednesdays, Classes are held at Christendom College Graduate School (4407 Sano Street, Alexandria, VA). Books are provided. Please register by contacting the parish office at (703) 354-8711 or by emailing s.gray@queenofapostles.org. An inquiry form can be sent or, you may stop by the parish office (4329 Sano Street) to complete the form. Please bring birth and baptismal certificates.

For couples not married in the church, our priests are willing to help you prepare for the Sacrament of Matrimony, an important step to receiving the other Sacraments and living the Catholic faith. Please contact the parish office and set an appointment to meet with a priest.

Pastor's Letter

The On-Deck Circle

Last Wednesday we had Michael McGuire's Funeral Mass. I would like that this Pastor's letter be a tribute to him and all our generous volunteers serving the Parish Family through our varied ministries. As you know, he has been, along with his sister Patty, the Parish Candle Master for many years. His ministry provided that we could always find votive candles ready to light in our clean and well-polished candle stands. Through that ministry, he supported our devotion, our prayers, and helped to make visible the light of faith and prayer. Those votive candles invite us to stop for a moment when we pass by them as we go into the Church.

Our Ministries Fair was a call to our parishioners to jump into the on-deck circle, to be the next one to bat in the parish game. Baseball players don't want to be in the hole. Why would we be at ease in the hole, just watching the game?

Great players train hard to be ready to come up and hit the winning ball. In today's Gospel Jesus reminds us that we need to be ready to give up those things which would restrain us in following him, "If your hand causes you to sin, cut it off... And if your eye causes you to sin, pluck it out. Better for you to enter into the kingdom of God with one eye than with two eyes to be thrown into Gehenna" (Mk 9:43-47).

It is serious. Jesus sets clearly what is entailed to take the cross and follow him. We don't train for the World Series. We train for holiness and heaven. So why wouldn't we be ready to fast, to exercise, to choose the proper diet, to have enough rest and sleep so that we are at our best when we enter the batter's box? And don't take me wrong. The batter's box is not Mass. It is life, and we go to Mass as to the gym to be healed, strengthened, and, becoming one with Jesus, get ready to "go in peace, glorifying the Lord by your life" (Mass Dismissal).

After the seventh day, Saturday, we take a break and we go to Mass: "Take me out to the ball game." Yes, Jesus is our coach and wants us being part of the game. He is calling us from the on-deck circle into the batter's box. Let us get ready to jump in and win the game!
