The Best Gift of All 17

"I made known to them your name, and I will make it known, that the love with which you have loved me may be in them, and I in them."

John 17:26

Jesus worked many miracles on earth. He taught us that He is God, and how much God loves us. But, Jesus knew that He was going to die soon. He loved us so very much that He found a way to be with us after He died.

The special supper Jesus shared with His Apostles on the night before He died is called the Last Supper. At the Last Supper, Jesus took bread and blessed it. He said, "Take this and eat of it. This is My Body." Then Jesus took a cup of wine and said, "This is the chalice of My Blood." Jesus changed bread and wine into His own Body and Blood. When the Apostles ate this Bread, Jesus lived inside them.

Then Jesus did something amazing. He gave His Apostles the power to change bread and wine into His Body and Blood. The Apostles, in turn, passed on this power to all the bishops and priests who came after them, right up to today.

The priest at your church has received this power too. Because he has this power, when your priest offers Mass, he does what Jesus did at the Last Supper. When he says the words of Jesus, the bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Jesus. And when the people receive Holy Communion, Jesus comes to live in them. This is the best gift Jesus could have given us. It is the gift of Himself.


